The study of the blood flow is called hemodynamics, and the study of the properties of the blood flow is called hemorrheology. Blood can behave as a non-Newtonian fluid, and is most commonly studied using rheology. Because blood vessels are not rigid tubes; classic hydrodynamics based on the use of classical viscometers are not capable of explaining haemodynamics.

Hemodynamics The hemodynamic response continuously monitors and adjusts to conditions in the body and its environment. uniform pressure in the arteries indicate that these blood vessels act as a pressure reservoir for fluids that are transported within them. Hemodynamics explains the physical laws that govern the flow of blood in the blood vessels. Pressure drops gradually Hemodynamics or haemodynamics are the dynamics of blood flow. The circulatory system is controlled by homeostatic mechanisms of autoregulation, just as hydraulic circuits are controlled by control systems

Symptoms may include dizziness, lightheadedness, confusion, feeling tired, weakness, headache, blurred vision, nausea, neck or back pain, an irregular heartbeat or feeling that the heart is skipping beats or fluttering, and fainting. Hypotension is the opposite of hypertension, which is high blood pressure. It is best understood as a physiological state rather than a disease. Severely low blood pressure can deprive the brain and other vital organs of oxygen... Blood pressure is one of the vital signs—together with respiratory rate, heart rate, oxygen saturation, and body temperature—that healthcare professionals use in evaluating a patient's health. Normal resting blood pressure in an adult is under 120/80 mmHg according to the AHA and ACC, and under 120/70 mmHg according to the ESC, and over 90/60 mmHg, though low blood pressure is usually not...

Orthostatic hypotension Moderate drops in blood pressure can cause Orthostatic hypotension, also known as postural hypotension or commonly known as headrush, is a medical condition wherein a person's blood pressure drops (hypotension) when they are standing up (orthostasis) or sitting down. known low blood pressure. Primary orthostatic hypotension is also often referred to as neurogenic orthostatic hypotension. Severe drops in blood pressure can lead to fainting, with a possibility of injury. It occurs predominantly by delayed (or absent) constriction of the lower body blood vessels, which is normally required to maintain adequate blood pressure when changing the position to standing. The drop in blood pressure may be sudden (vasovagal orthostatic hypotension), within 3 minutes (classic orthostatic hypotension) or gradual (delayed orthostatic hypotension). As a result, blood pools in the blood vessels of the legs for a longer period, and less is returned to the heart, thereby leading to a reduced cardiac output and inadequate blood flow to the brain. It is defined as a fall in systolic blood pressure of at least 20 mmHg or diastolic blood pressure of at least 10 mmHg after 3 minutes of standing

A vacuum gauge is used to measure pressures lower than the ambient atmospheric pressure, which is set as the zero point, in negative values (for instance, -1 bar or -760 mmHg equals total vacuum). Most gauges measure pressure relative to atmospheric pressure as the zero point, so this form of reading is simply referred to as "gauge pressure". However, anything greater than total vacuum is technically a form of pressure. For very low pressures, a gauge that uses total vacuum as the zero point reference must be used, giving pressure reading as an absolute pressure.

Pressure measurement The widely used Bourdon gauge is a mechanical device, which both measures and indicates and is probably the best known type of gauge. Many

techniques have been developed for the measurement of pressure and vacuum. Pressure is typically expressed in units of pascals in the International System of Units (SI). For very low pressures, a gauge that uses total vacuum as the zero point reference must be used, giving pressure reading as an Pressure measurement is the measurement of an applied force per unit area by a fluid (liquid or gas) on a surface. Blood pressure It is measured in millimetres of mercury (mmHg) above the surrounding atmospheric pressure, or in kilopascals (kPa). The difference between the systolic and diastolic pressures is known as pulse pressure, while the average pressure during a cardiac cycle is known as mean arterial pressure. Most of this pressure results from the heart pumping blood Blood pressure (BP) is the pressure of circulating blood against the walls of blood vessels. When used without qualification, the term "blood pressure" refers to the pressure in a brachial artery, where it is most commonly measured. Most of this pressure results from the heart pumping blood through the circulatory system. Blood pressure is usually expressed in terms of the systolic pressure (maximum pressure during one heartbeat) over diastolic pressure (minimum pressure between heartbeats) in the cardiac cycle. Hypotension Different numbers apply to children. A systolic blood pressure of less than 90 millimeters of mercury (mmHg) or diastolic of less than 60 mmHg is generally considered to be hypotension. Blood pressure is the force of blood pushing against the walls of the arteries as the heart pumps out blood and is indicated by two numbers, the systolic blood pressure (the top number) and the diastolic blood pressure (the bottom number), which are the maximum and minimum blood pressures within the cardiac cycle, respectively.
