The origin of the current flag of Spain is the naval ensign of 1785, Pabellón de la Marina de Guerra, by Decree of Charles III of Spain, where it is also referred as national flag. It was chosen by Charles III among 12 different flags designed by Antonio Valdés y Bazán. The flag remained marine-focused for most of the next 50 years and flew over coastal fortresses, marine barracks and other naval properties. During the Peninsular War, the bicolor flag was used by marine regiments fighting inland, and began to be also used in Army camps and raised by many Spaniards as a symbol of resistance. In 1843, during the reign of Queen Isabella II of Spain, the flag was adopted by all the Armed Forces. Initially self-taught, she later continued her education through private classes in the studios of artists Ricardo Grau, Cristina Gálvez and Germán Suárez Vértiz, which she attended for a period of five years. Following this period, Gómez-Sánchez quickly began to experiment with non-traditional materials, such as sand and sawdust, to achieve innovative textures on the surfaces of her paintings. The band's 1984 self-titled debut album featured a new wave and ska influenced sound, which evolved into a post-punk style found on

their subsequent albums *Nada personal* (1985), *Signos* (1986), and *Doble Vida* (1988). The band's 1990 album *Canción Animal* featured the alternative rock anthem "De Música Ligera", their best-known song in Latin America. On their last two albums, *Dynamo* (1992) and *Sueño Stereo* (1995), their sound evolved to incorporate genres such as shoegaze and art rock. His work has earned him nine Gardel Awards (Argentina's main music awards) and three Latin Grammy Awards, all for Best Recording Package, receiving the award for Mercedes Sosa's *Cantora 1* (2009), Vicentico's *Solo un Momento* (2011) and Juana Molina's *Wed 21* (2014). He currently holds the records for most wins and most nominations (seven) in the category. 1d6cd7cd38 Customarily, the PDC backs specific initiatives in an effort to bridge socialism and laissez-faire capitalism. This economic system has been called "social capitalism" and is heavily influenced by Catholic social teaching or, more generally, Christian ethics. In addition to this objective, the PDC also supports a strong national government while remaining more conservative on social issues. However, after Pinochet's military regime ended the PDC embraced more classical economic policies compared to before the dictatorship. The current Secretary-General of the PDC is Gonzalo Duarte. In their latest "Ideological Congress", the Christian Democrats criticized Chile's current economic system and called for a shift toward a social market economy (economía social de mercado). With... Ribeyro studied literature and law in Universidad Católica in Lima. In 1960 he immigrated to Paris where he worked as a journalist in France Presse and then as cultural advisor and ambassador to UNESCO. He was an avid smoker, as described in his short story “Sólo para fumadores” (For smokers only), and he died as a result of his addiction. The characters in his stories, often autobiographical and usually written in simple but ironic language, tend to end up with their hopes cruelly dashed. But despite its apparent pessimism, Ribeyro's work is often comic, its humor springing from both the author's sense of irony and the accidents that befall his protagonists. A collection was published under the title La palabra del mudo (The Word of the Mute).

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
