Significant genetic variants are present for most of the behavioral traits. There is a consistency in detection of genetic variants and genomic association for traits derived from pedigree. The field developed in the 19th century alongside historical linguistics and became closely associated with large-scale dialect surveys and the production of dialect maps and linguistic atlases. Such work typically relies on systematic data collection (for example, questionnaires, interviews, and recordings) and represents the geographic distribution of linguistic features using concepts such as isoglosses and dialect boundaries.

Connick v. Myers 138 (1983), is a United States Supreme Court decision concerning the First Amendment rights of public employees who speak on matters of possible public concern within the workplace context. It was first brought by Sheila Myers, an Orleans Parish, Louisiana, assistant district attorney (ADA). After the Fifth Circuit affirmed the verdict, Connick appealed to the Supreme Court. She had been fired by her superior, District Attorney Harry Connick Sr. At trial, Judge Jack Gordon of the Eastern District of Louisiana found the firing had been motivated by the questionnaire and was thus an

infringement on her right to speak out on matters of public concern as a public employee. Myers, 461 U. S. 586, when, after receiving a transfer she had fiercely resisted in private conversations with him and his chief assistant district attorney, she distributed a questionnaire to her fellow prosecutors asking about their experience with Connick's management practices. Multiple Indicator Cluster Surveys As of MICS6, a questionnaire for children age 5–17, administered to the mother of a randomly selected child The Multiple Indicator Cluster Surveys (MICS) are household surveys implemented by countries under the programme developed by the United Nations Children's Fund to provide internationally comparable, statistically rigorous data on the situation of children and women. UNICEF in Bangladesh adapted this Extended CES to additional indicators and conducted the first ever MICS for 28 indicators in all 64 districts of Bangladesh in 1993 and published a book 'Progathir Pathey'. The surveys were first developed in India with the support of UNICEF as part of the Child Survival and Safe Motherhood programme where an "Extended" CES modelled around the Immunization CES Surveys were conceived and conducted at district and state level as part of the CSSM programme launched in 1992. The Extended CES in India included indicators related to Diarrhoea, Vitamin A and Malnutrition in the case of children and Antenatal visits and maternal immunization for mothers. The survey covered 22 indicators. included in the generic set of questionnaires. India followed suit and added the additional indicators and conducted its own MICS in three different settings - Urban, Rural and Tribal and together were involved in a global meeting at Dhaka in August 1994

responses to closed-ended questions and prompted the study of the pseudo-opinion phenomenon. It has become a classic example of the risks of meaningless responses to closed-ended questions. The Metallic Metals Act was a fictional piece of legislation included in a 1947 American opinion survey conducted by Sam Gill and published in the March 14, 1947, issue of Tide magazine. 70% of respondents claimed to have an opinion on the act.

== Features ==

Questionnaires have advantages over some other types of survey tools in that they are cheap, do not require as much effort from the questioner as verbal or telephone surveys, and often have standardized answers that make it simple to compile data. However, such standardized answers may frustrate users as the possible answers may not accurately represent their desired responses. Questionnaires are also sharply limited by the fact that respondents must be able to read the questions and respond to them. Thus, for some demographic groups conducting a survey by questionnaire may not be concretely feasible...

One of the first questionnaires, regarded as an early ethnographic questionnaire, is the “Instructions [for] antiquarians and historians of the Kingdom”, commissioned by the King of Sweden in 1630.
