== Symptoms == a39ccde63e Meningoencephalitis may begin as inflammation of either the brain or meninges that then progresses to involve both regions. Infectious causes include viruses, bacteria, fungi, or protozoan parasites. The inflammation can also be non-infectious in origin, such as autoimmune diseases. a39ccde63e Various vaccine candidates have been developed, the first ones in the 1920s, but none has been successful to date. a39ccde63e Shingles is caused by the varicella zoster virus (VZV) that also causes chickenpox. In the case of chickenpox, also called varicella, the initial infection with the virus typically occurs during childhood or adolescence. Once the chickenpox has resolved, the virus can remain dormant (inactive) in human nerve cells (dorsal root ganglia or cranial nerves) for years or decades, after which it may reactivate and travel along nerve bodies to nerve endings in the skin, producing blisters. During an outbreak of shingles, exposure... a39ccde63e HHV-6A and HHV-6B are double-stranded DNA viruses within the Betaherpesvirinae subfamily and of the genus Roseolovirus. Symptoms, when they occur, may include watery blisters in the skin of any location of the body, or in mucous membranes of the mouth, lips, nose, genitals, or eyes (herpes simplex keratitis). Lesions heal with a scab characteristic of herpetic disease. Sometimes, the viruses cause mild or atypical symptoms during outbreaks. However, they can also cause more troublesome forms of herpes simplex. As neurotropic and neuroinvasive viruses, HSV-1 and -2 persist in the body by hiding from the immune system in the cell bodies of neurons, particularly in sensory ganglia. Shingles Other common symptoms are fever, headache, and tiredness. Two to four days before the rash occurs, there may be tingling or local pain in the area. Shingles, also known as herpes zoster or zona, is a viral disease characterized by a painful skin rash with blisters in a localized area. Typically the rash occurs in a single, wide mark either on the left or right side of the body or face. The rash usually heals within four weeks, but some people develop ongoing nerve pain which can last for months or years, a condition called postherpetic neuralgia (PHN). Typically the Shingles, also known as herpes zoster or zona, is a viral disease characterized by a painful skin rash with blisters in a localized area. In those with poor immune function the rash may occur widely. If the rash involves the eye, vision loss may occur a39ccde63e

HHV-6B primary infection is the cause of the common childhood illness exanthema subitum (also known as roseola infantum or sixth disease). It is passed on from child to child. It is uncommon for adults to contract this disease as most people have had it by kindergarten, and once contracted, immunity arises and prevents future reinfection. The cause is usually herpes simplex virus type 1 (HSV-1) and occasionally herpes simplex virus type 2 (HSV-2). The infection is typically spread between people by direct non-sexual contact. Attacks can be triggered by sunlight, fever, psychological stress, or a menstrual period. Direct contact with the genitals can result in genital herpes. Diagnosis is usually based on symptoms but can be confirmed with specific testing. Symptoms may include headache, fever, pain in neck movement, light sensitivity, and seizure. Signs of meningoencephalitis include unusual behavior, personality changes, nausea, and thinking problems. Both herpes simplex virus types (HSV-1 and HSV-2) share a high rate of sequence homology, so the development of a prophylactic-therapeutic vaccine that proves effective against one type of the virus would likely aid in the development of the other. As of 2020, several vaccine candidates are in different stages of clinical trials.

Mollaret's meningitis last for weeks to months. Herpes simplex Mollaret's meningitis is a recurrent or chronic inflammation of the protective membranes covering the brain and spinal cord, known collectively as the meninges. It was named for Pierre Mollaret, the French neurologist who first described it in 1944. [citation needed] While herpes simplex and varicella can cause rash, Mollaret's patients may or may not have a rash. Since Mollaret's meningitis is a recurrent, benign (non-cancerous), aseptic meningitis, it is also referred to as benign recurrent lymphocytic meningitis

The disease is typically spread by direct genital contact with the skin surface or secretions of someone who is infected. This may occur during sex, including anal, oral, and manual sex. Sores are not required for transmission to occur. The risk of spread between a couple is about 7.5% over a year. HSV is classified into two types, HSV-1 and HSV-2. While historically HSV-2 was more common, genital HSV-1 has become more common in the developed world. Diagnosis may occur by testing lesions using either PCR or viral culture or blood tests for specific antibodies.

Onset is typically around 4 days after exposure with symptoms lasting up to 4 weeks. When symptoms do occur, they typically include small blisters that break open to form painful ulcers. Once infected further outbreaks may occur but are generally milder. Flu-like symptoms, such as fever, aching, or swollen lymph nodes, may also occur

Cold sore Diagnosis is usually based on symptoms but can be confirmed with specific testing. The virus may periodically reactivate to create another outbreak of sores in the mouth or lip. Diagnosis can be elusive, as Helbok et al. note: "in reality, many more weeks, even months pass by until the diagnosis is established. In many cases the signs and symptoms of chronic meningitis not only persist for periods longer than 4 weeks, they even progress with continuing deterioration, i. e. headache, neck stiffness and even low grade fever.
