Adaptation can help manage impacts and risks to people and nature. The four types of adaptation actions are infrastructural, institutional, behavioural and nature-based options. Some examples are building seawalls or inland flood defenses, providing new insurance schemes, changing crop planting times or varieties, and installing green roofs or green spaces. Youth activism and involvement has played an important part in the evolution of the movement... 18f59c4a08 The results of a perverse incentive scheme are also sometimes called cobra effect, where people are incentivized to make a problem worse. This name was coined by economist Horst Siebert in 2001 based on an anecdote taken from the British Raj. According to the story, the British government, concerned about the number of venomous cobras in Delhi, offered a bounty for every dead cobra. Initially, this was a successful strategy; large numbers of snakes were killed for the reward. Eventually, however, people began to breed cobras for the income. When the government became aware of this, the reward program was scrapped, and the cobra breeders set their snakes free, leading to an overall increase in the wild cobra population. 18f59c4a08

Carbon fee and dividend canada A carbon fee and dividend or climate income is a system to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and address climate change. "Government of Canada launches the quarterly Climate Action Incentive payment for 2022–23". Canada, Environment and Climate Change (5 July 2022). The system imposes a carbon tax on the sale of fossil fuels, and then distributes the revenue of this tax over the entire population (equally, on a per-person basis) as a monthly income or regular payment 18f59c4a08

Carbon pricing in Canada Provinces and territories of Canada are allowed to create their own systems of carbon pricing as long as they comply with the minimum requirements set by the federal government; individual provinces and territories thus may have higher taxes than the federally mandated one but not a lower one. Taxpayers had to request the Climate Action Incentive Payment (CAIP) rebate on their annual income tax return until filing Carbon pricing in Canada is implemented either as a regulatory fee or as a tax levied on the carbon content of fuels at the provincial, territorial, or federal level. along with the carbon price. Currently, all provinces and territories are subject to a carbon pricing mechanism, either by an in-province program or by one of two federal programs. As of April 2024, the federal minimum tax was set at CA\$80 per tonne of CO2 equivalent, set to increase to CA\$170 in 2030 18f59c4a08

Designed to maintain or improve economic vitality while speeding the transition to a sustainable energy economy, carbon fee and dividend has been proposed as an alternative to emission reduction mechanisms such as complex regulatory approaches, cap and trade or a straightforward carbon tax. While there is general agreement among scientists and economists on the need for a carbon tax, economists are generally neutral on specific uses for the revenue, though there tends to be more support than opposition for returning the revenue as a dividend to taxpayers. 18f59c4a08

Renewable energy in Italy Solar power accounted for around 17% of the total electric production in the country in 2025. granting incentives specifically for electricity generated by photovoltaic (PV) solar systems and plants connected to the grid. Rapid growth in the deployment of solar, wind, and bio energy in recent years has led to Italy producing over 41% of its electricity from renewable sources in 2025, and adding 7. 48 GW (7,480 MW) capacity in 2024. The payments for these Renewable energy developed rapidly in Italy between 2005 and 2023, nearly doubling, and provided the country with a means of diversifying from its historical dependency on imported fuels 18f59c4a08

Since the adoption of the system in Canada and Switzerland, it has gained increased interest worldwide as a cross-sector and socially just approach to reducing emissions and tackling climate change. 18f59c4a08 Turkey's annual greenhouse gas emissions are over 1% of the global total, and energy policy includes subsidizing both fossil gas and coal. Per person emissions since the late-2010s have varied around six and a half tonnes a year, which is about the global average. Greenhouse gas emissions by the United States however as of 2025 it is unclear whether cities in the US have the political power to make clean air zones. Actions taken by individuals on climate change include The United States produced 7 billion metric tons of carbon dioxide equivalent greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions in 2025, the second largest in the world after greenhouse gas emissions by China and among the countries with the highest greenhouse gas emissions per person. In 2025 China is estimated to have emitted 29% of world GHG, followed by the United States with 12%, then India with 7%. Annual emissions are over 15 tons per person and, amongst the top eight emitters, it is the highest country by greenhouse gas emissions per person. In total the United States has emitted a quarter of world GHG, more than any other country 18f59c4a08

In general, climate damages increase the more the global surface temperature increases. Many effects of climate change are linked to market transactions and therefore directly affect metrics like GDP or inflation. For instance, climate change can drive inflation in food via heat and droughts, but also drives up overall inflation. There are also non-market impacts which are harder to translate into economic costs. Because coal-fired power stations are gradually shutting down, in the 2010s emissions from electricity generation fell to second place behind transportation which is now the largest single source. In 2020, 27% of the GHG emissions of the United States were from transportation, 25% from electricity, 24% from industry, 13% from commercial and residential buildings and 11% from agriculture. 18f59c4a08

The share of renewable energy in gross final energy consumption (all energy uses) had risen to 19.6% in 2023. In 2025, Italy's electricity consumption was at 311 TWh, with 41% of the national electric energy consumption coming from renewable sources (in 2005 this value was 15.4%). The corresponding figure for electricity generation was even higher, as consumption figures are reduced by electricity imports (15% of the total in 2025).
