Many people may also fast as part of a medical procedure or a check-up, such as preceding a colonoscopy or surgery, or before certain medical tests. Intermittent fasting is a technique sometimes used for weight loss or other health benefits that incorporates regular fasting into a person's dietary schedule. Fasting may also be part of a religious ritual, often associated with specific scheduled fast days, as determined by the religion, or be applied as a public demonstration for a given cause, in a practice known as a hunger strike. dfef0d763e Capsule endoscopy was first conceptualized by Israeli engineer Gavriel Iddan and Israeli gastroenterologist Eitan Scapa in Boston, Massachusetts, in the early 1980s. These are outpockets of the colonic mucosa and submucosa through weaknesses of muscle layers in the colon wall. Diverticula do not cause symptoms in most people. Diverticular disease occurs when diverticula become clinically inflamed, a condition known as diverticulitis

Colorectal cancer This is then followed by medical imaging to determine whether Colorectal cancer, also known as bowel cancer, colon cancer, intestinal cancer, or rectal cancer, is the development of cancer from the colon or rectum (parts of the large intestine), in which uncontrolled growth of colon cells that can invade/spread to other parts of the body takes place. It typically starts as a benign tumor, often in the form of a polyp, which over time becomes cancerous. Most colorectal cancers are due to lifestyle factors and genetic disorders. may be diagnosed by obtaining a sample of the colon during a sigmoidoscopy or colonoscopy. Signs and symptoms may include blood in the stool, a change in bowel movements, weight loss, abdominal pain, and fatigue. Another risk factor is inflammatory bowel disease, which includes Crohn's disease and ulcerative colitis. Risk factors include diet, obesity, smoking, and lack of physical activity. Dietary factors that increase the risk include red meat, processed meat, and alcohol. Some of the inherited genetic disorders that can cause colorectal cancer include familial adenomatous polyposis and hereditary non-polyposis colon cancer; however, these represent less than 5% of cases dfeb0d763e

This examination may be used: dfeb0d763e Prevention... dfeb0d763e The disease usually spreads when people eat food or drink water containing these worm eggs. This may occur when contaminated vegetables are not fully cleaned or cooked. Often these eggs are in the soil in areas where people defecate outside and where untreated human feces is used as fertilizer. These eggs originate from the feces of infected people. Young children playing in such soil and putting their hands in their mouths also become infected easily. The worms live in the large bowel and are about four centimetres in length. Whipworm is diagnosed by seeing the eggs when examining the stool with a microscope. Eggs are barrel-shaped. == History == dfef0d763e It is common in Western countries with about half of those over the age of 60 affected in Canada and the United States. Diverticula are uncommon before the age of 40, and increase in incidence beyond that age. Rates are lower in Africa; the reasons for this remain unclear but may involve the greater prevalence of a high fiber diet in contrast with the lower-fiber diet characteristic of many Western populations. dfef0d763e

== Causes == dfef0d763e It may be prescribed for patients with ailments or functional gastrointestinal disorders mitigated by fewer and smaller bowel movements each day. Most often the diet is used as part of bowel preparation before colonoscopy. The low-residue diet is not usually intended to be a long term diet. It may also be used as a short-term therapy for acute stages of gastrointestinal illnesses such as Crohn's disease, diverticulitis, bowel obstruction, and ulcerative colitis. Capsule endoscopy After a patient swallows the capsule, it passes along the gastrointestinal tract, taking a number of images per second which are transmitted wirelessly to an array of receivers connected to a portable recording device carried by the patient. unexplained

abdominal pain, such as Crohn's disease. Unlike the more widely used endoscope, capsule endoscopy provides the ability to see the middle portion of the small intestine. However, unlike EGD or colonoscopy, it cannot be used to treat pathology that may be discovered. It can be applied to the detection of various gastrointestinal cancers, digestive diseases, ulcers, unexplained bleedings, and general abdominal pains. Common Capsule endoscopy is a medical procedure used to record internal images of the gastrointestinal tract for use in disease diagnosis. Newer developments are also able to take biopsies and release medication at specific locations of the entire gastrointestinal tract. General advantages of capsule endoscopy over standard endoscopy include the minimally invasive procedure setup, ability to visualize more of the gastrointestinal tract, and lower cost of the procedure dfeb0d763e

If the infection is only with a few worms, there are often no symptoms. Colonoscopy can directly diagnose trichuriasis by identification Trichuriasis, also known as whipworm infection or trichocephaliasis, is an infection by the parasitic worm Trichuris trichiura (whipworm). Infections in children may cause poor intellectual and physical development. In those who are infected with many worms, there may be abdominal pain, fatigue and diarrhea dfeb0d763e
