This resulted in families being split along racial lines; those of more European appearance and ancestry assimilated into the wider white population, while those with predominately African features and ancestry assimilated into the black population. 9284ce3caf Henderson is famous for a definition of nursing: "The unique function of the nurse is to assist the individual, sick or well, in the performance of those activities contributing to health or its recovery (or to peaceful death) that he would perform unaided if he had the necessary strength, will or knowledge" (first published in Henderson & Nite 1978, p. 5, 1955 ed.). She is known as "the first lady of nursing" and has been called, "arguably the most famous nurse of the 20th century" and "the quintessential nurse of the twentieth century". In a 1996 article in the Journal of Advanced Nursing Edward Halloran wrote, "Virginia Henderson's written works will be viewed as the 20th century equivalent of those of the founder of modern nursing, Florence Nightingale." 9284ce3caf 300 – Entry of Christian women into nursing. 9284ce3caf

History of hospitals The Romans did not have dedicated, public hospitals. Towards the end of the 4th century, the "second medical revolution" took place with the founding of the first Christian hospital in the eastern Byzantine Empire by Basil of Caesarea, and within a few decades, such hospitals had become

ubiquitous in Byzantine society. The hospital would undergo development and progress throughout Byzantine, medieval European and Islamic societies from the 5th to the 15th century. Public hospitals, per se, did not exist until the Christian period. The Greek temples were dedicated to the sick and infirm but did not look anything like modern hospitals.
