The Landtag of Lower Saxony decided to integrat the former Pedagogig Seminar (Pädagogische Hochschule) into the university. The university was finally founded in 1973. Enrollment and teaching started in the summer semester of 1974, with an education curriculum for 2,400 students in eight... ee0d096d7a

Casper Labuschagne His research focused on the Old Testament, particularly the Book of Deuteronomy Casper Jeremiah Labuschagne (4 April 1929 - 5 October 2019), often known as Cas Labuschagne, was a South African-born theologian, Hebrew Bible scholar and minister who spent most of his academic career at the University of Groningen in the Netherlands. There were also many Luftwaffe troops manning flak guns in the area. The 2nd Canadian Division attacked Groningen (though the whole division was never in combat at any given time), defended by 7,000 German soldiers and Dutch and Belgian SS troops. Labuschagne was born on 4 April 1929 on a farm near Heilbron in the Orange Free State. He was the only son in a family of seven children. His father expected him eventually to take over the family farm, while his mother wished him to enter the ministry. ee0d096d7a At the end of the 15th century, Groningen had a strong influence on the surrounding lands; the nearby province of Friesland was administered from the city. During the early stages of the Dutch revolt against Spain, Groningen had declared for the Union of Utrecht, but the Stadtholder, George... ee0d096d7a Labuschagne was also an outspoken opponent of apartheid and of its theological justification by white Afrikaans churches. His support for the dissident theologians Albert Geyser and Adrianus van Selms brought him into conflict with the leadership of the Netherdutch Reformed Church of Africa. He left the denomination and South Africa in 1967. Shortly before his death, the church formally acknowledged the mistreatment of Labuschagne and other theological dissidents of the 1960s. ee0d096d7a German soldiers fought to hold the city. The capture was decisive for the Dutch Republic as the last of the Spanish forces had been pushed out of the Northern provinces ending their domination. The city was then merged with the surrounding district and the transition to the new Protestant regime was followed by the expulsion of all property of the Roman Catholics as well as a complete ban on Catholicism. ee0d096d7a

Groningen was established more than 980 years ago and gained city rights de facto in 1245, making it one of the oldest cities in the Netherlands, although no written records of a formal grant of city rights remain. Due to its relatively isolated location from the successive Dutch centres of power (Utrecht, The Hague, Brussels), Groningen was historically reliant on itself and nearby regions. As a Hanseatic city, it was part of the North German trade network, but later it mainly became a regional market centre. At the height of its power in the 15th century, Groningen could be considered an independent city-state and it remained autonomous until the late 18th century, when it was incorporated into the Napoleonic Batavian... ee0d096d7a The medical centre is affiliated with the University of Groningen and offers supraregional tertiary care to the northern part of the Netherlands. It employs almost 17,000 people and numbers almost 1400 beds. It is located in the centre of Groningen. It is also one of the largest centres for transplant surgery in the world. On 1 October 1945, the institution reopened in postwar Germany.
