Personal name Historically and colloquially, the term "personal name" has also been synonymous with "given name" or "first name", in exclusion of other types of names that may make up an individual's full name. When taken together as a phrase, they all relate to that one individual. A personal name, full name or prosoponym (from Ancient Greek *prósōpon* – person, and *onoma* – name) is the set of names by which an individual person or animal is known. In many cultures, the term is synonymous with the birth name or legal name of the individual. In linguistic classification, personal names of people are studied within a specific onomastic discipline, called anthroponymy

When people marry or divorce, the legal aspects of changing names may be simplified or included, so that the new name is established as part of the legal process of marrying or divorcing. Unlike these countries, Icelanders have continued to use their traditional name system, which was formerly used in most of Northern Europe. Icelandic surnames are different from most other naming systems in the modern Western world in that Icelandic names are names used by people from Iceland. Iceland shares a common cultural heritage with the Scandinavian countries of Denmark, Norway, and Sweden. The Icelandic system is thus not based on family names (although some people do have family names and might use both systems). Icelandic surnames are different from most other naming systems in the modern Western world in that they are patronymic or occasionally matronymic: they indicate the father (or mother) of the child and not the historic family lineage. Generally, a person's last name indicates the first name of their father (patronymic) or in some cases mother (matronymic) in the genitive, followed by -son ("son"), -dóttir ("daughter") or -bur ("child").
