Other factors include certain infections, exposure to ionizing radiation, and environmental pollutants. Infection with specific viruses, bacteria, and parasites causes approximately 16–18% of cancers worldwide. These infectious agents include Helicobacter pylori, hepatitis B, hepatitis C, and HPV. Human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) does not directly cause cancer, but it causes immune deficiency that can increase the risk of cancer from other infections, sometimes up to several thousandfold. Incisional biopsies and core biopsies sample a portion of the abnormal tissue without attempting to remove the entire lesion or tumor. Other types include punch biopsies and shave biopsies. In a fine needle aspiration biopsy, a sample of tissue or fluid is removed with a needle in such a way that cells are removed without preserving the histological architecture of the tissue cells. The process involves the extraction of sample cells or tissues for examination to determine the presence or extent of a disease.
