Septicemic plague is mainly spread by infected fleas that live on small mammals, but can also result from handling infected mammals. It can develop either directly from exposure to *Y. pestis* or as a complication of untreated bubonic plague. In the case of primary infection, *Y. pestis* bacteria enter the skin after a flea bite and travel throughout the bloodstream, showing no localizing signs of infection. This makes diagnosis difficult, as plague is generally rare and initial symptoms resemble several other, more common... b0125981ba

Septicemic plague It is one of three forms of plague, along with bubonic (affecting the lymph nodes) and pneumonic (affecting the lungs) plagues. *pestis* rapidly infects the bloodstream, initially causing nonspecific symptoms including fever, chills, malaise, abdominal pain, diarrhea, and vomiting. Left untreated, septicemic plague is almost always fatal, sometimes within hours of initial symptoms. Spray-and-vaccinate campaigns have aimed at preventing the spread
Septicemic plague is one of three types of plague caused by *Yersinia pestis*, a gram-negative species of bacterium. Listeria is ubiquitous and is primarily transmitted via the oral route after ingestion of contaminated food products, after which the bacteria penetrate the intestinal tract to cause systemic infections. The diagnosis of listeriosis requires the isolation of the causative bacteria from the blood or the cerebrospinal fluid. Treatment includes prolonged administration of antibiotics, primarily ampicillin and gentamicin, to which the organism is usually susceptible. b0125981ba Prior to the Vietnam war less than a handful of patients had diagnosed in the United States in the twentieth century. In 1966, Murray Spotnitz, M.D., the chief of Pulmonary Medicine at Valley Forge Army Hospital, discovered that a number of servicemen with delayed onset of pulmonary infections had previously been deployed in Vietnam. Spotnitz coined the term "Vietnam Time Bomb" to highlight the fact that *B. pseudomallei* could remain dormant for years. The term gained traction as subsequent studies revealed latent infections in Vietnam veterans with estimates suggesting up to 250,000 U.S. soldiers were exposed. Spotnitz was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross by President Lyndon Johnson at a White House ceremony. b0125981ba The outbreak killed 30 people and infected several more. Public health officials credited the lessons learned from the San Francisco outbreak with saving lives, and swiftly implemented preventative measures, including hospitalization of the sick and all their contacts, a neighborhood quarantine, and a large-scale rat eradication program. The epicenter of the plague was in the Macy Street District, primarily home to Mexican immigrants, which was also known... b0125981ba In theory, liquid breathing could assist in the treatment of patients with severe pulmonary or cardiac trauma, especially in pediatric and neonatal cases. 1924 Los Angeles pneumonic plague outbreak The suspected reason for this outbreak was a rat epizootic where squirrels that were found to be plague infected were secondarily infected by rats. The 1924 Los Angeles pneumonic plague outbreak was an outbreak of the pneumonic plague in Los Angeles, California that began on September 28, 1924, and was declared fully contained on November 13, 1924. Due to the evidence of infected squirrels near San Luis Obispo County as late as July 1924 and the migration habits of both squirrels and rats, it is thought that squirrels were the original source of the plague outbreak in Los Angeles. Buildings

were also sprayed with hydrogen cyanide, rodenticide, and sulfur. It represented the first time that the plague had emerged in Southern California since plague outbreaks had previously surfaced in San Francisco and Oakland. ripped off their siding to allow stray cats and dogs to eat infected rats b0125981ba

Agar plates for melioidosis Melioidosis is an infectious disease caused by a gram-negative bacterium called *Burkholderia pseudomallei*. *pseudomallei* experience no symptoms, but complications can range from fever and skin changes to pneumonia, abscesses, and septic shock, which can be fatal. Approximately 10% of people with melioidosis develop symptoms that last longer than two months, termed "chronic melioidosis" b0125981ba

Listeriosis The disease primarily affects Listeriosis is a bacterial infection most commonly caused by *Listeria monocytogenes*, although *L. grayi* have been reported in certain cases. includes prolonged administration of antibiotics, primarily ampicillin and gentamicin, to which the organism is usually susceptible. Those at risk of severe illness are the elderly, fetuses, newborns, and those who are immunocompromised. Listeriosis may cause mild, self-limiting gastroenteritis and fever in anyone. *ivanovii* and *L. Listeriosis* can cause severe illness, including severe sepsis, meningitis, or encephalitis, sometimes resulting in lifelong harm and even death. In pregnant women, it may cause stillbirth or spontaneous abortion, and preterm birth is common b0125981ba

The liquid involved requires certain physical properties, such as respiratory gas solubility, density, viscosity, vapor pressure and lipid solubility, which some perfluorochemicals (PFCs) have. Thus, it is critical to choose the appropriate PFC for a specific biomedical application, such as liquid ventilation, drug delivery or blood substitutes. The physical properties of PFC liquids vary substantially; however, the one common property is their high solubility for respiratory gases. That is, by an intrinsic property of the drug formulation, rather than by special mixing and handling.
