== History == 72210291d7 The toy spaniels which were the predecessors of the Cavalier changed dramatically in the nineteenth century, when they were inter-bred with flat-nosed breeds. Until the 1920s, the Cavalier shared the same history as the smaller King Charles Spaniel. Breeders attempted to recreate what they considered to be the original configuration – a dog resembling Charles II's spaniel of the English Civil War period, when supporters of the king were known as Cavaliers. 72210291d7

Norfolk Spaniel The theory of The Norfolk Spaniel or Shropshire Spaniel is a breed of dog which has been extinct since the early 20th century. It was originally thought to have originated from the work of one of the Dukes of Norfolk, but this theory was disproven after being in doubt during the later part of the 19th century. The term was also used to designate springer type spaniels that were neither Sussex nor Clumber Spaniels, and attempts were made to use it to specify a breed that would later become known as the English Springer Spaniel. Duke of Norfolk's spaniels were of the King Charles type and that terrier stock had nothing to do with the origins of the Norfolk Spaniel 72210291d7

Toy Trawler Spaniel It was considered to be on the verge of extinction by 1920. It is considered to have descended from the original King Charles Spaniel, and the older variety of the Sussex Spaniel. The "cocking" or "cocker spaniel" was a type of field or land spaniel in the 19th century. Prior to 1901, Cocker Spaniels were only separated from Field Spaniels and Springer Spaniels by weight. Two dogs are considered to be the foundation sires of both modern breeds. The English variety are descended from Ch. Obo, while the American breed descends from Obo's son, Ch. Obo II. In the United States, the English Cocker was recognized as separate... 72210291d7

Welsh Springer Spaniel Thought to be comparable to the old Land Spaniel, they are similar to the English Springer Spaniel and historically have been referred to as both the Welsh Spaniel and the Welsh Cocker Spaniel. They were relatively unknown until a succession of victories in dog trials by the breed increased its popularity. The origin of the Welsh Springer Spaniel is unknown, but dogs resembling the breed with its distinctive red and white coat The Welsh Springer Spaniel (Welsh: Llamgi Cymru or Tarfgi Cymru) is a breed of dog and a member of the spaniel family. Health conditions are limited to those common among many breeds of dog, although they are affected more than average by hip dysplasia and some eye conditions. They are a working dog, bred for hunting, and while not as rare as some varieties of spaniel, they are rarer than the more widely known English Springer Spaniel with which they are sometimes confused. The breed's coat only comes in a single colour combination of white with red markings, usually in a piebald pattern. they are sometimes confused. Following recognition by The Kennel Club in 1902, the breed gained the modern name of Welsh Springer Spaniel. English Cocker Spaniel English Cocker Spaniels are also known as the "Merry Spaniel" due to their constantly wagging tails. flush woodcocks. Spaniel type dogs have been found in art and literature for almost 500 years. It is one of several varieties of spaniel and is the foundation of its American cousin, the American Cocker Spaniel. It is noteworthy for producing one of the most varied numbers of pups in a litter among all dog breeds. The English Cocker Spaniel is an active, good-natured, sporting dog standing well up at the withers and compactly built. With a liver-and-white or black-and-white coat, the Norfolk Spaniel was described as being a large Cocker Spaniel. The Spaniel Club set out a breed standard for Norfolk Spaniels, but specimens of

the breed varied greatly across England. Members of the breed were difficult to train, but formed a strong attachment with their owners and were useful for hunting both on land and in water. The breed ceased to exist after 1903, when it was rolled into the new English Springer Spaniel breed created by The Kennel Club to contain all spaniels of this type. 72210291d7 Thought to have originated in East Asia, and possibly acquired by European traders via the Spice Road, early toy spaniels were first seen in Europe during the 16th century. They became linked with English royalty during the rule of Queen Mary I (from 1553 to 1558), eventually earning their name after being made famous by their association with King Charles II. Ruling from 1660 to 1685, Charles II owned many small dogs which accompanied him and his entourage about their daily business. Members of the breed were also owned by Queen Victoria (Dash) and her great-granddaughter Grand Duchess Anastasia Nikolaevna of Russia. 72210291d7 The history of the breed is uncertain prior to the mid-19th century with two theories being prevalent. Clumber Spaniels have been kept and bred by various members of the British Royal Family, including Prince Albert, King Edward VII and King George V. They were introduced into Canada in 1844, and in 1884 became one of the first ten breeds recognised by the American Kennel Club. The breed can suffer from a variety of breed-specific ailments varying in severity from temporary lameness due to bone growth whilst young to hip dysplasia or spinal disc herniation. 72210291d7

Clumber Spaniel Ectropion is the outward The Clumber Spaniel is a breed of dog of the spaniel type, developed in the United Kingdom. The name of the breed is taken from Clumber Park in Nottinghamshire where the breed was first developed. It is the largest of the spaniels, and comes in predominantly white with either lemon or orange markings.
