Body louse They are oval and usually yellow to white in color and The body louse (Pediculus humanus humanus, also known as Pediculus humanus corporis) or clothing louse, informally called the cootie, is a hematophagic ectoparasite louse that infests humans. place until it hatches, while the nits (empty egg shells) may remain for months on the clothing. Generally, however, it is not a serious condition. During a person's first infection, the itch may not develop for up to six weeks. The itch may cause problems with sleeping. Itching from lice bites is common. Studies have detected bacterial pathogens in head lice, but detection alone does not prove that head lice can transmit infection to humans. Although body lice are established vectors of several bacterial diseases, the role of head lice in disease transmission remains uncertain

Since 2023, all rounds of the tournament are played at various sites across the country which are selected annually. Predating the NCAA Division I men's basketball tournament by one year, the NIT was considered the most prestigious post-season showcase for college basketball before its status was superseded in the mid-1950s by the NCAA tournament. A second, much more recent "NIT" tournament is played in November and known as the NIT Season Tip-Off

Lice are obligate parasites, living externally on warm-blooded hosts, which include most species of bird and mammal, notably excluding monotremes, pangolins, bats, sirenians, tapirs, rhinoceroses, and members of the clade and suborder Whippomorpha (Cetaceans and Hippopotamids). Chewing lice live among the hairs or feathers of their host and feed on skin and debris, whereas sucking lice pierce the host's skin and feed on blood and other secretions. They usually spend their whole life on a single host, cementing their eggs, called nits, to hairs or feathers. The eggs hatch into nymphs, which moult three times before becoming fully grown, a process that takes about four weeks.

Head lice are spread by direct contact with the hair of someone who is infected. The cause of head lice infestations in children is not related to cleanliness. Other animals, such as cats and dogs, do not play a role in transmission. Head lice feed only on human blood and are only able to survive on human head hair. When adults, they are about 2 to 3 mm long. When not attached to a human, they are unable to live beyond three days. Humans can also become infected with two other lice – the... Body lice are disease vectors and can transmit pathogens that cause human diseases such as epidemic typhus, trench fever, and relapsing fever. In developed countries, infestations are only a problem in areas of poverty where there is poor body hygiene, crowded living conditions, and a lack of access to clean clothing. Outbreaks can also occur in situations where large groups of people are forced to live in unsanitary conditions. These types of outbreaks are seen globally in prisons, homeless populations, refugees of war, or when natural disasters occur and proper sanitation is not available.

Bovicola ovis As obligate parasites, lice do not survive long anywhere other than a sheep body. Lice are small, measuring just 1. It belongs to the order Phthiraptera, the parvorder Trichodectera, and the genus Bovicola. It does not pierce the skin to drink blood; rather, it feeds on hair and oil secretions, loose skin flakes, and epidermal debris at the base of the wool. It spreads from sheep to sheep via direct contact of fleeces, and lives on their skin and wool. every three days. After one to three weeks, females become infertile and die. Since body lice cannot jump or fly, they spread by direct contact with another person or more rarely by contact with clothing or bed sheets that are infested. 0b5e974427 The non-disease-carrying head louse differs from the related disease-carrying body louse (*Pediculus humanus humanus*) in preferring to attach eggs to scalp hair rather than to clothing. The two subspecies are morphologically almost identical, but do not normally interbreed. From genetic studies, they are thought to have diverged as subspecies approximately 30,000–110,000 years ago, when many humans began to wear significant amounts of clothing.
