

Permethrin Cream 5 Uses

Terconazole is approved to treat vulvovaginal candidiasis (vaginal thrush). Permethrin is in the pyrethroid family of medications. It works by disrupting the function of the neurons of arthropods such as lice, mites, insects, and shrimp, making it highly toxic to these animals. It is also highly toxic to fish.
