Ultraviolet However, some sunscreen chemicals produce Ultraviolet radiation (UV; sometimes called ultraviolet light) is electromagnetic radiation of wavelengths of 100–400 nanometers, shorter than that of visible light, but longer than X-rays. It is also produced by electric arcs, Cherenkov radiation, and specialized lights, such as mercury-vapor lamps, tanning lamps, and black lights. radiation by using sunscreen. The first two, along with a number of less common skin cancers, are known as nonmelanoma skin cancer (NMSC). It usually presents as a hard lump with a scaly top but may also form an ulcer. They are due to the development of abnormal cells that have the ability to invade or spread to other parts of the body. Skin cancer is the most commonly diagnosed form of cancer in humans. There are three main types of skin cancers: basal-cell skin cancer (BCC), squamous-cell skin cancer (SCC) and melanoma. Squamous-cell skin cancer is more likely to spread. It is not clear if sunscreen affects the risk Skin cancers are cancers that arise from the skin. Basal-cell cancer grows slowly and can damage the tissue around it but is unlikely to spread to distant areas or result in death. The primary cause of skin cancer is prolonged exposure to ultraviolet (UV) radiation from the sun or tanning devices. It occurs when skin cells grow uncontrollably, forming malignant tumors.
