organisms that spread the disease. Treatment is with the antibiotic doxycycline. Epidemic typhus generally occurs in outbreaks when poor sanitary conditions and crowding are present. While once common, it is now rare. Scrub typhus occurs in Southeast Asia, Japan, and northern Australia. Murine typhus occurs in tropical and subtropical areas of the world. Correlation does not imply causation The idea that "correlation implies causation" is an example of a questionable-cause logical fallacy, in which two events occurring together are taken to have established a cause-and-effect relationship. The phrase "correlation does not imply causation" refers to the inability to legitimately deduce a cause-and-effect relationship between two events or variables solely on the basis of an observed association or correlation between them.

He was abandoned by his mother, who worked as a sex worker, to a foundling home, and then was later taken in by a foster family. When his foster mother died, however, his status within the house changed and he was seen as a domestic servant. He stole and ran away from reformatory school repeatedly between the ages of fifteen and eighteen, was imprisoned, and ultimately got sent back to the reformatory institution from which he had fled. 9b747aed43 The non-disease-carrying head louse differs from the related disease-carrying body louse (*Pediculus humanus humanus*) in preferring to attach eggs to scalp hair rather than to clothing. The two subspecies are morphologically almost identical, but do not normally interbreed. Chewing lice live among the hairs or feathers of their host and feed on skin and debris, whereas sucking lice pierce the host's skin and feed on blood and other secretions.
