Amputation of the arm, leg, jaw, or half of the pelvis (called a hemipelvectomy) may be necessary in some Chondrosarcoma is a bone sarcoma, a primary cancer composed of cells derived from transformed cells that produce cartilage. Unlike other primary bone sarcomas that mainly affect children and adolescents, a chondrosarcoma can present at any age. A chondrosarcoma is a member of a category of tumors of bone and soft tissue known as sarcomas. It more often affects the axial skeleton than the appendicular skeleton 58c5f0726b

Osteopetrosis Additionally Osteopetrosis, literally 'bone becoming stone', also known as marble bone disease or Albers-Schönberg disease, is an extremely rare inherited disorder whereby the bones harden, becoming denser, in contrast to more prevalent conditions like osteoporosis, in which the bones become less dense and more brittle, or osteomalacia, in which the bones soften. include endobone or 'bone-within-bone' appearance in the spine, pelvis and proximal femora, upper limbs, and short tubular bones of the hand. Osteopetrosis can cause bones to dissolve and break 58c5f0726b

Femoral fracture (AP) and lateral radiographs are typically obtained. In order to rule out other injuries, hip, pelvis, and knee radiographs are also obtained. Thus, mentions of femoral fracture in medicine usually refer implicitly to femoral fractures at the shaft or distally. They are typically sustained in high-impact trauma, such as car crashes, due to the large amount of force needed to break the bone. Fractures of the diaphysis, or middle of the femur, are managed differently from those at the head, neck, and trochanter; those are conventionally called hip fractures (because they involve the hip joint region) 58c5f0726b

The coccyx is located at the base of the spine, under the sacrum. It is the last section of the ape vertebral column. Most commonly in humans it comprises 3 to 5 fused (or, more rarely, separate) vertebrae, and is approximately 4 to 10 cm in length. The coccyx is attached to the sacrum by a fibrocartilaginous joint, called the sacrococcygeal symphysis, allowing for some (but little) movement. 58c5f0726b The vertical diameter of the lateral half is increased by the obliquity of the lower

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edge, which slopes downward to join the body at the level of the lesser trochanter, so that it measures one-third more than the antero-posterior diameter. 58c5f0726b The holotype skeleton of Antlerpeton, ANS VP 19909, is the only known specimen of the genus. It was found in a block of mudstone in the form of fragmentary bones and natural molds. A latex impression was made to study ANS VP 19909 in greater detail. No other plant or animal fossils were found in the surrounding area. Antlerpeton was first described by Keith Stewart Thomson, Neil Shubin, and Forrest Poole in 1998. It was named after the Antler highlands, a group of mountains in Nevada and Utah that formed during the Late Devonian and Early Carboniferous. The type species *A. clarkii* was named for Charles W. Skeletonization is collected, bones and non bone materials will be mixed together. Skeletonization refers to the final stage of decomposition, during which the last vestiges of the soft tissues of a corpse or carcass have decayed or dried to the point that the skeleton is exposed. In order to avoid non bone materials being misinterpreted as bones, the following Skeletonization is the state of a dead organism after undergoing decomposition. By the end of the skeletonization process, all soft tissue will have been eliminated, leaving only disarticulated bones 58c5f0726b

Bone grafting prevent movement, repair broken bones that have bone loss, and repair broken bone that has not yet healed. Additionally, structural or morcellized bone grafting can be used in joint replacement revision surgery when wide osteolysis is present. While some small or acute fractures can heal without bone grafting, the risk is greater for large fractures, such as compound fractures. This surgical procedure is useful for repairing bone fractures that are extremely complex, pose a significant health risk to the patient, or fail to heal properly, leading to pseudoarthrosis. Furthermore, bone grafts or substitutes are Bone grafting is a type of transplantation used to replace missing bone tissue or stimulate the healing of fractures 58c5f0726b

Antlerpeton It is known from a single poorly preserved skeleton from the Diamond Peak Formation of Eureka County. and a pair of two small bones that fit in front of it. A mix of features in its compound vertebrae suggest that Antlerpeton is a primitive stem tetrapod that has affinities with later, more advanced forms. The spinal cord passes through the larger bones, while the smaller bones are positioned to either Antlerpeton is an extinct genus of early tetrapod from the Early Carboniferous of Nevada. Its robust pelvis and hind limbs allowed for effective locomotion on land, but the animal was likely still tied to a semiaquatic lifestyle near the coast 58c5f0726b

The anterior surface of the neck is perforated by numerous vascular foramina. 58c5f0726b Bone generally has the ability to regenerate completely but requires a very small fracture space or some sort of scaffold to do so. Bone grafts may be autologous (bone harvested from the patient's own body, often from the iliac crest), allograft (cadaveric bone usually obtained from a bone bank), or synthetic (often made of hydroxyapatite or other naturally occurring and biocompatible substances) with similar mechanical properties to bone. Most bone grafts are expected to be resorbed and replaced as the natural bone heals over a few months'

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time. 58c5f0726b Fractures are commonly obvious, since femoral fractures are often caused by high energy trauma. Signs of fracture include swelling, deformity, and shortening of the leg. Extensive soft-tissue injury, bleeding, and shock are common. The most common symptom is severe pain, which prevents movement of the leg. 58c5f0726b The superior border is short and thick, and ends laterally at the greater trochanter... 58c5f0726b Emergency treatment generally follows advanced trauma life support. This begins with efforts to stop bleeding and replace fluids. Bleeding control may be achieved by using a pelvic binder or bed-sheet to support the pelvis. Bones protect the organs of the body, produce red and white blood cells, store minerals, help regulate acid-base homeostasis, provide structure and support for the body, and enable mobility and hearing. Anatomists use A bone is a rigid organ that constitutes part of the skeleton in most vertebrate animals. Examples include the ethmoid and sphenoid bones. sinuses. The bones of the spine, pelvis, and some bones of the skull are irregular bones 58c5f0726b

Common causes include falls, motor vehicle collisions, a vehicle hitting a pedestrian, or a direct crush injury. In younger people significant trauma is typically required while in older people less significant trauma can result in a fracture. They are divided into two types: stable and unstable. Unstable fractures are further divided into anterior posterior compression, lateral compression, vertical shear, and combined mechanism fractures. Diagnosis is suspected based on symptoms and examination with confirmation by X-rays or CT scan. If a person is fully awake and has no pain of the pelvis medical imaging is not needed. 58c5f0726b

Pelvic fracture This includes any break of the sacrum, hip bones (ischium, pubis, ilium), or tailbone. It is one of the hereditary causes of osteosclerosis. It is considered to be the prototype of osteosclerosing dysplasias. The cause of the disease is understood to be malfunctioning osteoclasts and their inability to resorb bone. Although human osteopetrosis is a heterogeneous disorder encompassing different molecular lesions and a range of clinical features, all forms share a single pathogenic nexus in the osteoclast. The exact molecular defects or location of the mutations taking place are unknown. 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above the intertrochanteric crest. 58c5f0726b == Signs and symptoms == 58c5f0726b Bone tissue (also known as osseous tissue or bone in the uncountable) is a form of hard tissue, specialised connective tissue that is mineralized and has an intercellular honeycomb-like matrix, which helps to give the bone rigidity. Bone tissue is made up of different types of bone cells: osteoblasts and osteocytes (which form and mineralise bone respectively), osteoclasts (which resorb bone), and modified or flattened osteoblasts (lining cells that form a protective layer on the bone surface). The mineralised matrix of bone tissue has an organic component of mainly ossein, a form of collagen, and an inorganic component of bone mineral, made up of various salts. Bone tissue comprises cortical (compact) bone and cancellous (spongy) bone, although bones may also contain other kinds of tissue including bone... 58c5f0726b

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
