Sun tanning Some people tan or sunburn more easily than others. Excessive exposure to ultraviolet rays has negative health effects, including sunburn. Some people use chemical products that can produce a tanning effect without exposure to ultraviolet radiation, known as sunless tanning. It is most often a result of exposure to ultraviolet (UV) radiation from sunlight or from artificial sources, such as a tanning lamp found in indoor tanning beds. the body. People who deliberately tan their skin by exposure to the sun engage in a passive recreational activity of sun bathing. Health effects of sunlight exposure On the positive side, UV exposure enables the synthesis of vitamin D3, which is essential for bone health and potentially plays a role in inhibiting certain cancers. Additionally, exposure to visible light supports melatonin synthesis, maintains circadian rhythms, improves cognitive function, including motor learning capabilities, enhanced object recognition memory, and strengthened synaptic plasticity, and reduces the risk of seasonal affective disorder. for the skin, posing significant risks. While vitamin D can also be obtained through dietary supplements, UV exposure offers benefits such as enhanced subdermal nitric oxide production and improved endorphin levels, which are not achievable through supplementation alone. The tanning effect of dihydroxyacetone (DHA) was discovered in the 1950s by Eva Wittgenstein at Cincinnati Children's Hospital, who observed that DHA used in an oral treatment stained the skin brown on contact. The first commercial DHA self-tanner, Man-Tan, appeared in 1959, followed by Coppertone's "QT" (Quick Tan) in 1960; both produced an orange-toned result that gave early self-tanners a poor reputation. Reformulated products and, from the late 1990s, automated... 31163f824e Indoor tanning became widespread in the Western world in the late 1970s. The practice finds a cultural parallel in skin whitening in Asian countries, and both support multibillion-dollar industries. Most indoor tanners are women, 16–25 years old, who want to improve their appearance or mood, acquire a pre-holiday tan, or treat a skin condition.

The photons of ultraviolet have greater energy than those of visible light, from about 3.1 to 12 electron volts, around the minimum energy required to ionize atoms. Although long-wavelength ultraviolet is not considered an ionizing radiation because its photons lack sufficient energy, it can induce chemical reactions and cause many substances to glow or fluoresce. Many practical applications, including chemical and biological effects, are derived from the way that UV radiation can interact with organic molecules. DHA concentration is adjusted to provide darker and lighter shades of tan. The reaction of keratin protein present in skin and DHA is responsible for the production of pigmentation. 31163f824e The black areas of a bay horse's hair coat are called "black points", and without them, a horse is not a bay horse. Black points may sometimes be covered by white markings; however such markings do not alter a horse's classification as "bay". Bay horses have dark skin – except under white markings, where the skin is pink. Genetically, bay occurs when a horse carries both the Agouti gene modifying the extension gene that creates black base coat. DHA is a hygroscopic white crystalline powder. It has a sweet cooling taste and a characteristic odor. It is the simplest of all ketoses and has no chiral center. The normal form is a dimer (2,5-bis(hydroxymethyl)-1,4-dioxane-2,5-diol). The dimer slowly dissolves in water, whereupon it converts to the monomer. These solutions are stable at pH's between 4 and 6.
