== History == Background == Biography == The SEC filed a complaint with the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York on April 16, 2010 against GS&Co. and Fabrice Tourre, an employee of GS&Co. The complaint charged the defendants with

securities fraud regarding their synthetic collateralized debt obligation (CDO). The synthetic CDO in question was ABACUS, tied to subprime residential mortgage-backed securities.
