Mefloquine is sometimes preferred Malaria prophylaxis refers to measures used to prevent malaria infection in individuals at risk of exposure to Plasmodium parasites transmitted by Anopheles mosquitoes. These measures include mosquito bite avoidance strategies and the use of antimalarial medications taken before, during, and after exposure. effective at reducing the risk of malaria for short-term travelers and are similar with regard to their risk of serious side effects. Prophylactic medication is commonly recommended for travelers to endemic regions and for certain populations living in areas with ongoing malaria transmission

Use is not generally recommended in early pregnancy. However, there are no other options and if treatment may save the mother's life it may be used. Halofantrine Marketed as Halfan, halofantrine is never used to prevent malaria and its mode of action is unknown, although a crystallographic study showed that it binds to hemozoin in vitro, suggesting a possible mechanism of action. Halofantrine's structure contains a substituted phenanthrene, and is related to the antimalarial drugs quinine and lumefantrine. A full course of treatment (6 tablets) costs US\$1. Halfan (GlaxoSmithKline) is available as 250 mg tablets. Halofantrine Halofantrine is a drug used to treat malaria. 40 in the developing world. Artemether/lumefantrine It is used to treat malaria caused by Plasmodium falciparum that is not treatable with chloroquine. artemether-lumefantrine dispersible tablets compared with crushed commercial tablets in African infants and children with uncomplicated malaria: a randomised, single-blind Artemether/lumefantrine, sold under the trade name Coartem among others, is a combination of the two medications artemether and lumefantrine. It can be associated with cardiotoxicity. The most dangerous side effect is cardiac arrhythmias: halofantrine causes significant QT prolongation, and this effect is seen even at standard doses. The drug should therefore not be given to patients with cardiac conduction defects and should not be combined with mefloquine. Common side effects include abdominal pain, vomiting, diarrhea, cough, and itchiness. Serious side effects may include anaphylaxis, Stevens-Johnson syndrome,

hallucinations, and liver problems. Side effects are generally mild. It is unclear if use during pregnancy or breastfeeding is safe for the baby. It is not recommended to prevent malaria in those with poor kidney function. Atovaquone works by interfering with the function of mitochondria in malaria while proguanil blocks dihydrofolate reductase. c67aade44f

Because malaria tends to be more severe in pregnancy, the benefit typically outweighs the risk. If used during pregnancy it should be taken with folate.
