Standard treatment for ulcerative colitis depends on extent of involvement and disease severity. The goal is to induce remission initially with medications, followed by the administration of

maintenance medications to prevent a relapse of the disease. The concept of induction of remission and maintenance of remission is very important. The medications used to induce and maintain a remission somewhat overlap, but the treatments are different. Physicians first direct treatment to inducing a remission which involves relief of symptoms and mucosal healing of the lining of the colon and then longer-term treatment to maintain the remission.

It is also available by itself in a long-acting form sold under the brand name Zohydro ER, among others, to treat severe pain of a prolonged duration. Hydrocodone is a controlled drug; in the United States, it is classified as a Schedule II Controlled Substance. Typically, it is dispensed as the combination acetaminophen/hydrocodone

or ibuprofen/hydrocodone for pain severe enough to require an opioid and in combination with homatropine methylbromide to relieve cough

568b5d5a31 Common side effects include dizziness, sleepiness, nausea, and constipation. Serious side effects may include low blood pressure, seizures, QT prolongation, respiratory depression, and serotonin syndrome. Rapidly decreasing the dose may result in opioid withdrawal. Use during pregnancy or breastfeeding is generally not recommended. Hydrocodone is believed to work by activating opioid receptors, mainly in the brain and spinal cord. Hydrocodone 10 mg is equivalent to about 10 mg of morphine by mouth. 568b5d5a31

The combination relies on multimodal analgesia, integrating the central antinociceptive properties of opioids with the peripheral anti-inflammatory and antiplatelet effects of salicylates to achieve synergistic pain relief
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Management of ulcerative colitis Ulcerative colitis is a form of colitis, a disease of the intestine, specifically the large intestine or colon,

that includes characteristic ulcers, or open sores, in the colon. The free radical induction Management of ulcerative colitis involves first treating the acute symptoms of the disease, then maintaining remission. Ulcerative colitis is, however, a systemic disease that affects many parts of the body outside the intestine. In 1897, scientists at the drug and dye firm Bayer began investigating acetylated organic compounds as possible new medicines, following the success of acetanilide ten years earlier. Two years later, Bayer created acetylsalicylic acid, which they marketed around the world under the brand name "Aspirin". The drug was sold widely in the first half of the twentieth century, both by Bayer and by competing drug manufacturers. The name "aspirin" was so widely used that Bayer lost (or sold) the rights to the trademark in many countries. 568b5d5a31 Historically marketed under brand names such as Lortab ASA, Damason-P, and Azdone, the use of this combination has declined significantly in contemporary medical practice. This reduction is attributed to safety concerns regarding aspirin toxicity—specifically gastrointestinal bleeding and Reye's syndrome—and strict regulatory changes. In 2014, the United States Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) rescheduled

all hydrocodone combination products from Schedule III to the more restrictive Schedule II to curb the opioid epidemic. 568b5d5a31 Aspirin's popularity declined after the development of acetaminophen/paracetamol in 1956 and ibuprofen in 1962. For pain or fever, effects typically begin within 30 minutes.
