== Description == f9612c66ad The usage of red coats by English soldiers dates back to the Tudor period, when the Yeomen of the Guard and the Yeomen Warders were both equipped in the royal colours of the House of Tudor, red and gold. Stained glass windows were used in churches to enhance their beauty and to inform the viewer through narrative or symbolism. The subject matter was generally religious in churches, though "portraits" and heraldry were often included. f9612c66ad == Taxonomy and evolution == f9612c66ad The red coat was widely (though not exclusively) used by the infantry and some cavalry units of the British military plus the Royal Marines, from the 16th to the early 20th centuries. The garment was also widely used by the British Colonial Auxiliary Forces and the British Indian Army during the same period. Though, by the 20th century, the red coat was abandoned for practical duties in favour of khaki by all British Empire military units, it continues to be used for ceremonial full dress and mess dress uniforms in many countries of the Commonwealth of Nations. f9612c66ad

Medieval stained glass For much of this period stained glass windows were the major pictorial art form, particularly in northern France, Germany and England, where windows tended to be larger than in southern Europe (in Italy, for example, frescos were more common). seen in three dimensional form on glass windows. Prior to c. 1000, most coloured glass was of a soda-lime-silica composition. In Northern Europe soda glass Medieval stained glass is the colored and painted glass of medieval Europe from the 10th century to the 16th century. == Description == f9612c66ad The toga was considered Rome's "national costume," privileged to Roman citizens but for day-to-day activities most Romans preferred more casual, practical and comfortable clothing; the tunic, in various forms, was the basic garment for all classes, both sexes and most occupations. It was usually made of linen, and was augmented as necessary with underwear, or with various kinds of cold-or-wet weather wear, such as knee-breeches for men, and cloaks, coats and hats. In colder parts of the empire, full length trousers were worn. Most urban Romans wore shoes, slippers... f9612c66ad A standard urine test strip may comprise up to 10 different chemical pads or reagents which react (change color) when immersed in, and then removed from, a urine sample. The test can often be read in as little as 60 to 120 seconds after dipping, although certain tests require longer. Routine testing of the urine with multiparameter strips is the first step in the diagnosis of a wide range of diseases. The analysis includes testing for the presence of proteins, glucose, ketones, haemoglobin, bilirubin, urobilinogen, acetone, nitrite and leucocytes as well as testing of pH and specific gravity or to test for infection by different pathogens. f9612c66ad The test strips consist of a ribbon made of plastic or paper of about 5 millimetre wide. Plastic strips have pads impregnated with chemicals that react with the compounds present in urine producing a characteristic colour. For the paper strips the reactants are absorbed directly onto the paper. Paper strips are often specific to a single reaction (e.g. pH measurement), while the strips with pads allow several... f9612c66ad

The yellow-billed stork lies within the genus *Mycteria* along with three other extant species: the wood stork (*M. americana*), the milky stork (*M. cinerea*) and the painted stork (*M. leucocephala*). Species within *Mycteria* display remarkable homologies in behavior (e.g., feeding and courtship) and morphology, with relatively few species-specific variations. Following decades of studies by linguist Andrew Pawley and anthropologist Ralph Bulmer, Kalam is one of the best-studied Trans-New Guinea languages to date.

Fe'i banana Most are high in β -carotene (a precursor of vitamin A). They are usually eaten cooked and have been an important food for Pacific Islanders, moving with them as they migrated across the ocean. Found mainly in the islands of the Pacific, particularly French Polynesia, Fe'i bananas have skins which are brilliant orange to red in colour with yellow or orange flesh inside. They are very distinct in appearance and origin from the majority of bananas and plantains currently grown. One issue with Fe'i bananas is that eating them causes the production of yellow coloured urine, thought to be caused Fe'i bananas (also spelt Fehi or Féi) are cultivated plants in the genus *Musa*, used mainly for their fruit. varieties with deeply coloured flesh

== History ==

Orchis pallens It is found in most of Europe ranging from Spain across to the Caucasus. It blooms in spring with pale yellow flowers. In Central Europe, *O. pallens* is sometimes confused with yellow-flowering form of orchid, *Dactylorhiza*. *Orchis pallens*, the pale orchid or pale-flowered orchid, is a perennial herbaceous plant belonging to the genus *Orchis* of the family *Orchidaceae*. lanceolate shaped, green, shiny, bright, and smooth

As a material, stained glass is glass that has been coloured by adding metallic salts during its manufacture. It may then be further decorated in various ways. The coloured glass may be crafted into a stained-glass window, in which small pieces of glass are arranged to form patterns or pictures, held together (traditionally) by strips of lead, called comes or calms, and supported by a rigid frame. Painted details and yellow-coloured silver stain are often used to enhance the design. The term stained glass is also applied to enamelled glass in which the colors have been painted onto the glass and then fused to the glass in a kiln.

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
