Septicemic plague However Septicemic plague is one of three types of plague caused by *Yersinia pestis*, a gram-negative species of bacterium. Left untreated, septicemic plague is almost always fatal, sometimes within hours of initial symptoms. As the disease progresses, disseminated intravascular coagulation causes internal and external bleeding, gangrene, and shock. Septicemic plague is a systemic disease in which *Y. pestis* rapidly infects the bloodstream, initially causing nonspecific symptoms including fever, chills, malaise, abdominal pain, diarrhea, and vomiting. to bites from infected fleas. Murine typhus is also commonly known as endemic or flea-borne typhus, other names include shop, urban, Mexican, and rat typhus. There is no vaccine. Prevention is by avoiding tick bites by covering the skin, using DEET, or using permethrin treated clothing. Evidence regarding treatment, however, is limited. The antibiotic doxycycline appears useful. Chloramphenicol or azithromycin may also be used. The disease will also tend to resolve without treatment. Cat bites are usually considered minor injuries but can result in serious infection and cause rabies if inflicted by a rabid cat. Common symptoms include pain and swelling around the affected area. Sometimes, direct tissue damage from the cat bite can impair mobility or cause tenosynovitis or arthritis. In these cases, surgical consultation is needed to assess severity. Some unusual complications, like deep-vein thrombosis, subcutaneous emphysema and fetal tachycardia have been described. Flea Their claws keep them from being dislodged, and their mouthparts are adapted for piercing skin and sucking blood. Flea larvae are worm-like, with no limbs; they have chewing mouthparts and feed on organic debris left on their hosts' skin. Fleas live by ingesting the blood of their hosts. Adult fleas grow to about 3 millimetres (1/8 inch) long, are usually dark in color, and have bodies that are "flattened" sideways or narrow, enabling them to move through their hosts' fur or feathers. Some species can leap 50 times their body length, a feat second only to jumps made by another group of insects, the superfamily of froghoppers. Adult fleas grow to about 3 millimetres (1/8 inch) long Flea, the common name for the order Siphonaptera, includes 2,500 species of small flightless insects that live as external parasites of mammals and birds. Septicemic plague is mainly spread by infected fleas that live on small mammals, but can also result from handling infected mammals. It can develop either directly from exposure to *Y. pestis* or as a complication of untreated bubonic plague. In the case of primary infection, *Y. pestis* bacteria enter the skin after a flea bite and travel throughout the bloodstream, showing no localizing signs of infection. Murine typhus occurring via the faeces of fleas (typically *Xenopsylla*). The bacteria is excreted in the faeces of fleas and when a flea bite is scratched or picked at Murine typhus, also known as endemic typhus or flea-borne typhus, is a form of typhus caused by *Rickettsia typhi* transmitted by fleas (*Xenopsylla cheopis*), usually on rats, in contrast to epidemic typhus which is usually transmitted by lice. Most people who are infected do not realize that they have been bitten by fleas. Historically the term "hunger-typhus" was used in accounts by British POWs in Germany at the end of World War I when they described conditions in Germany. Murine typhus is an under-recognized entity, as it is often confused with viral illnesses 339b30ae07

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
