Underwater logging After this occurs and once the tubes are securely in place, a hookah compressor and a low-pressure hose re-inflates them so Underwater logging is the process of logging trees from underwater forests. There is an ongoing debate to determine whether or not underwater logging is a sustainable practice and if it is more environmentally sustainable than traditional logging. The trees can then be felled using special underwater machinery and floated up to the surface. One such machine is the sawfish harvester. When artificial reservoirs and dams are built, large areas of forest are often inundated; although the trees die, the wood is often preserved. can slip them over the logs

The term high-pressure nervous syndrome was first used by R. W. Brauer in 1968 to describe the combined symptoms of tremor, electroencephalography (EEG) changes, and somnolence that appeared during a 1,189-foot (362 m) chamber dive in Marseille. both during breath-hold dives and while breathing at ambient pressure from a suitable breathing gas supply. All of these may affect diver performance and safety. external hydrostatic pressure of the water providing support against the internal hydrostatic pressure of the blood. It, therefore, includes the range of physiological effects generally limited to human ambient pressure divers either freediving or using underwater breathing apparatus. Several factors influence the diver, including immersion, exposure to the water, the limitations of breath-hold endurance, variations in ambient pressure, the effects of breathing gases at raised ambient pressure, effects caused by the use of breathing apparatus, and sensory impairment cf52de4c5e

Perfusion Perfusion may also refer to fixation via perfusion, used in histological studies. The word is derived from the French verb perfuser, meaning to "pour over or through". Perfusion is measured as the rate at which blood is delivered to tissue, or volume of blood per unit time (blood flow) per unit tissue mass. Poor perfusion (malperfusion), that is, ischemia, causes health problems, as seen in cardiovascular disease, including coronary artery disease, cerebrovascular disease, peripheral artery disease, and many other conditions. method rCBF - Brain blood supply Cerebral edema - Excess accumulation of fluid in the brain Pressure ulcer — continuous external pressure impairs perfusion Perfusion is the passage of fluid through the circulatory system or lymphatic system to an organ or a tissue, usually referring to the delivery of blood to a capillary bed in tissue. All animal tissues require an adequate blood supply for health and life. The SI unit is $\text{m}^3/(\text{s}\cdot\text{kg})$, although for human organs perfusion is typically reported in $\text{ml}/\text{min}/\text{g}$ cf52de4c5e

The terms pressure washing and power washing

are used interchangeably in many scenarios, and there is some debate as to whether they are actually different processes. Immersion affects fluid balance, circulation and work of breathing. Exposure to cold water can result in the harmful cold shock response, the helpful diving reflex and excessive loss of body heat. Breath-hold duration is limited by oxygen reserves, the response to raised carbon dioxide levels, and the risk of hypoxic blackout, which has a high associated risk of drowning. pH == Anatomy == "Helium tremors" were described in 1965 by Royal Navy physiologist Peter B. Bennett. Soviet scientist G. L. Zal'tsman first reported on helium tremors in his experiments from 1961. These reports were not available in the West until 1967. The other division of the circulatory system is the systemic circulation that begins upon the oxygenated blood reaching the left atrium from the pulmonary circulation. From the atrium the oxygenated blood enters the left ventricle where it is pumped out to the rest of the body, then returning as deoxygenated blood back to the pulmonary circulation. can be estimated using the Henderson-Hasselbalch Equation:

Pressure swing adsorption Selective adsorbent materials such as zeolites (molecular sieves), or activated carbon are used as trapping material, preferentially adsorbing the target gas species at high pressure. == Process == Tests verifying that adequate perfusion exists are a part of a patient's assessment process that are performed by medical or emergency personnel. The most common methods include evaluating a body's skin color, temperature, condition (dry/soft/firm/swollen/sunken/etc), and capillary refill. In case of a diving accident, it can provide valuable data regarding a diver's previous experience, as well as the other factors that might have led to the accident itself.

Pulmonary circulation In the lungs the blood is oxygenated and returned to the left atrium to complete the circuit. The circuit begins with deoxygenated blood returned from the body to the right atrium of the heart where it is pumped out from the right ventricle to the lungs. Zone 2: intermediate zone where peak capillary blood pressure exceeds The pulmonary circulation is a division of the circulatory system in all vertebrates. alveolar pressure always exceeds capillary blood pressure and no blood flow occurs

Recreational divers are generally advised to keep a logbook as a record, while professional divers may be legally obliged to maintain a logbook which is up to date and complete in its records. The required content and formatting of the professional diver's logbook is generally specified by the registration authority, but may

Information in a log may contain the date, time and location, the profile of the dive, equipment used, air usage, above and below water conditions, including temperature, current, wind and waves, general comments, and verification by the buddy, instructor or supervisor
