Hypertrophic cardiomyopathy Specifically affected are the bundle branches that conduct impulses through the interventricular septum and into the Purkinje fibers, as these are responsible for the depolarization of contractile cells of both ventricles. This results in the heart being less able to pump blood effectively and also may cause electrical conduction problems. Many but not all cats have a heart murmur. The parts of the heart most commonly affected are the interventricular septum and the ventricles. Many cats that have a heart murmur do not have HCM. Frequently the first signs that a cat has HCM are tachypnea/dyspnea Hypertrophic cardiomyopathy (HCM, or HOCM when obstructive) is a condition in which muscle tissues of the heart become thickened without an obvious cause b856aa5c97

Common causes of heart failure include coronary artery disease, heart attack, high blood pressure, atrial fibrillation, valvular heart disease, excessive alcohol consumption, infection, and cardiomyopathy. These cause heart failure by altering the structure or the function of the heart or in some cases both. There are different types of heart failure: right-sided heart failure, which affects the right heart, left-sided heart failure, which affects the left heart, and biventricular heart failure, which affects both sides of the heart. Left-sided heart failure may be present with a reduced ejection fraction or with... b856aa5c97 == Measurement and normal values == b856aa5c97 Although symptoms vary based on which side of the heart is affected, HF typically presents with shortness of breath, excessive fatigue, and bilateral leg swelling. The severity of the heart failure is mainly decided based on ejection fraction and also measured by the severity of symptoms. Other conditions that have symptoms similar to heart failure include obesity, kidney failure, liver disease, anemia, and thyroid disease. b856aa5c97

Vertebral Heart Score 1 (cat) is considered normal; higher The Vertebral Heart Score (VHS) - also known as Vertebral Heart Size or Vertebral Heart Scale - is a measurement method used in veterinary medicine to assess the heart size of animals based on thoracic radiographs. 5 (dog) or 8. A VHS of < 10. The method involves projecting the long and short axes of the heart onto the thoracic vertebrae starting from the fourth thoracic vertebra and calculating the number of vertebrae these lengths cover. It allows for the evaluation of heart size independent of the patient's overall body size, similar to the cardio-thoracic ratio in human medicine. The VHS is primarily used in dogs to detect cardiomegaly (heart enlargement), particularly in cases of heart diseases associated with dilation, such as

dilated cardiomyopathy. 5 is generally considered normal for dogs, although higher values are accepted as physiological for certain breeds. Vertebral Heart Score is the sum of the vertebral lengths covered by the long and short axes. A VHS of up to 10. The VHS was established by Buchanan and Bücheler in 1995 b856aa5c97

There is a skeleton of fibrous tissue that surrounds the conduction system which can be seen on an ECG. People may be asymptomatic, or may have fatigue, leg swelling, and shortness of breath. It may also result in chest pain or fainting. Being dehydrated may aggravate the symptoms. Cardiac conduction system The pacemaking signal travels through the right atrium to the atrioventricular node, along the bundle of His, and through the bundle branches to Purkinje fibers in the walls of the ventricles. node at a relative rate of 60–100 bpm is known as a normal sinus rhythm. The Purkinje fibers transmit the signals more rapidly to stimulate contraction of the ventricles. If SA nodal impulses occur at a rate less than 60 bpm, the heart rhythm is known The cardiac conduction system (CCS, also called the electrical conduction system of the heart) transmits the signals generated by the sinoatrial node – the heart's pacemaker – to cause the heart muscle to contract, and pump blood through the body's circulatory system b856aa5c97
