Dry stone construction is best known in the context of stone walls, traditionally used for the boundaries of fields and churchyards, or as retaining walls for terracing, but dry stone shelters, houses and other structures also exist. This was shown as the second episode of the first season in the United Kingdom, ahead of "Volcano".
