Ear The inner ear sits in the bony labyrinth, and contains structures which are key to several senses: the semicircular canals, which enable balance and eye tracking when moving; the utricle and saccule, which enable balance when stationary; and the cochlea, which enables hearing. Evacuated substances captured, removed from the flowstream in another location, and held under vacuum are sometimes said to be collected by the vacuum system. Bioglass 45S5 is available commercially under the registered trade name NovaMin, which is owned by the pharmaceutical company GlaxoSmithKline. NovaMin is bioactive glass that has been ground into a fine particulate with a median size of less than 20 μm. It can reduce dentin hypersensitivity by blocking open dentinal tubules and by supplying calcium (Ca2+) and phosphate (PO3−4) ions to form hydroxycarbonate apatite (HCA), the principal mineral component of bone tissue in mammals. Barotrauma The term is usually applied when the gas volume involved already exists prior to decompression. Tissue rupture may be complicated by the introduction of gas into the local tissue or circulation through the initial trauma site, which can cause blockage of circulation at distant sites or interfere with the normal function of an organ by its presence. The initial damage is usually due to over-stretching the tissues in tension or shear, either directly by an expansion of the gas in the closed space or by pressure difference hydrostatically transmitted through the tissue. On descent, a pressure differential develops between the ambient water and the interior of this space Barotrauma is physical damage to body tissues caused by a difference in pressure between a gas space inside,

or in contact with, the body and the surrounding gas or liquid. Barotrauma can occur during both compression and decompression events. air-filled space between the eardrum and the blockage 0adff7f19a

The damaged area was named Wernicke's area, and is located in the left hemisphere's posterior superior temporal gyrus (Brodmann area 22). The brain's left side is the dominant side utilized for producing and understanding sign language, just as it is for speech. Soon after, in 1874, Carl Wernicke studied patients with the reverse deficits: patients could produce spoken language, but could not comprehend it. The damaged area was named Broca's area, and located in the left hemisphere's inferior frontal gyrus (Brodmann areas 44, 45).
