Corn (pathology) The visible portion of the corn tends to be more or less round, but corns are defined by having a hard tapering root that is directed inward, and pressure on the corn pushes this root deeper into the flesh (thus the Latin term *clavus* meaning "nail"). When on the feet, corns can be so painful as to interfere with walking.
