White sponge nevus This results in lesions which are thick, white and velvety on the inside of the cheeks within the mouth. The condition is benign and usually requires no treatment. It is caused by one or more mutations in genes coding for keratin, which causes a defect in the normal process of keratinization of the mucosa. WSN can, however, predispose affected individuals to over-growth/imbalance of the oral microbiota, which may require antibiotic and/or antifungal treatment. often mistaken for leukoplakia, therefore a positive diagnosis is important in order to eliminate serious/malignant pathologies. Different disease patterns can be identified according to the course of the illness, appearance of symptoms, degree of severity, or catalysts. Prognosis is hard to predict for individual cases of chronic hand eczema and usually differs from patient to patient. Fungal infection There is usually a rash with superficial infection. Fungal infection within the skin or under the skin may present with a lump and skin changes. Pneumonia-like symptoms or meningitis may occur with a deeper or systemic infection. Superficial fungal infections include common tinea of the skin, such as tinea of the body, groin, hands, feet and beard, and yeast infections such as pityriasis versicolor. Systemic fungal infections are more serious and include cryptococcosis, histoplasmosis, pneumocystis pneumonia, aspergillosis and mucormycosis. Different types are traditionally divided according to the part of the body affected: superficial, subcutaneous, and systemic. Signs and symptoms range widely.
