These symptoms tend to arise after long-term use of computers, staring at phone screens, digital devices, reading, or other activities that involve extended visual tasks. Various causes contribute to eye strain, including uncorrected vision problems, digital device usage, environmental factors, and underlying health conditions. When concentrating on a visually intense task, such as continuously focusing on a book or computer monitor, the ciliary muscles and the extra-ocular muscles are strained, also contributing to the symptoms.
