Efforts to address housing inequity date back by at least a century, ranging from designing model villages, rent control, and building public and cooperative housing. Diglossia In cases of three dialects, the term triglossia is used. When referring to two writing systems coexisting for a single language, the term digraphia is used. In formal situations, (H) is used; in informal situations, (L) is used.

Sometimes, (H) is used in informal situations and as spoken language. In linguistics, diglossia (dy-GLOSS-ee-ə, US also dy-GLAW-see-ə) is where two dialects or languages are used (in fairly strict compartmentalization) by a single language community. The H variety may have no native speakers within the community. In addition to the community's everyday or vernacular language variety (labeled "L" or "low" variety), a second, highly codified lect (labeled "H" or "high") is used in certain situations such as literature, formal education, or other specific settings, but not used normally for ordinary conversation. spoken language 36a47a1e58
