Ambiguous definitions can create concerns in the medical community. Physicians in several countries, including Ireland and Canada, have expressed concern over ambiguous definitions of abortion. Even in situations where there is a clear definition of abortion, it does not always match definitions of related terms in effect in the same jurisdiction.

Malvin Weisberg had operated Medical Analytic Laboratories in Santa Monica from 1976 until March 1981. Resuscitative hysterotomy her fetus. Combined with a laparotomy, the procedure results in a Caesarean section that removes the fetus, thereby abolishing the aortocaval compression caused by the pregnant uterus. This improves the mother's chances of return of spontaneous circulation, and may potentially also deliver a viable neonate. The procedure may be performed by obstetricians, emergency physicians or surgeons depending on the situation. Prior to viability (approximately 24 weeks gestation), it is not a resuscitative hysterotomy, also referred to as a perimortem Caesarean section (PMCS) or perimortem Caesarean delivery (PMCD), is a hysterotomy performed to resuscitate a woman in the middle to late pregnancy who has entered cardiac arrest. But for both, a resuscitative hysterotomy is the best chance of survival.

In modern, high-resource settings, medical viability is generally considered to be between 23 and 24 weeks' gestational age, meaning that these newborns have a <50% chance of either dying or surviving with severe impairment if active care is instituted; this applies to most fetuses at ≥24 weeks of gestation, and to some fetuses at 23 weeks' gestation with favourable risk factors. Globally, among extremely preterm infants (<28 weeks' gestational age) born between 2000 and 2024, approximately 61% survived to hospital discharge, with lower survival rates in low-income countries (32%) than in high-income

In the United States, the term "born alive" is defined by federal law known as the born alive rule. Live births are recorded on a U.S. Standard Certificate of Live Birth, also known as a birth certificate. The United States recorded 3,605,201 live births in 2020 which is a 4% decrease from 2019 and the 6th consecutive year of decline in births. 0d64a9304a The parents of a stillborn fetus sued for wrongful death, and the trial court dismissed the complaint on the grounds that there was no such cause of action. The Supreme Court of Ohio held that a cause of action would lie. The court recognized several statutory indicators that a stillborn fetus might properly be considered a decedent, including clauses in the Uniform Anatomical Gift Act and the rule against perpetuities. The court also recognized the arbitrariness of allowing recovery for wrongful death caused by negligently inflicted prenatal injuries in the case where the death occurs shortly after a live birth and disallowing recovering when the death occurred shortly before birth. Maternal-fetal conflict Legal and ethical considerations involving women's rights and the rights of the fetus as a patient and future child, have become more complicated with advances in medicine and technology. There are maternal-fetal conflict situations where the law becomes involved, but most physicians avoid involving the law for various reasons. One view is that a fetus has rights when it has an independent moral status. Maternal-fetal conflict, also known as obstetric conflict, occurs when a pregnant woman's (maternal) interests conflict with the interests of the fetus. independent moral status, the future fetus as a child, and the viability of the fetus. Keeler v.
