Human impact on the environment Overconsumption, overexploitation, pollution, and deforestation are also contributing to this problem. Modifying the environment to fit the needs of society (as in the built environment) is causing severe effects including global warming, environmental degradation (such as ocean acidification), mass extinction, and biodiversity loss, ecological crisis, and ecological collapse. Some human activities that cause damage (either directly or indirectly) to the environment on a global scale include population growth, neoliberal economic policies, and rapid economic growth. 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Marine protected area MPAs restrict human activity for a conservation purpose, typically to protect natural or cultural resources. MPAs can provide economic benefits by supporting the fishing industry through the revival of fish stocks, as well as job creation and other market benefits via ecotourism. has been reserved by law or other effective means to protect part or all of the enclosed environment. MPAs can provide value to mobile species. These marine areas can come in many forms ranging from wildlife refuges to research facilities. Governance of protected areas A Protected Area is “a clearly. endeavor including “the preservation, maintenance, sustainable use, restoration, and enhancement of the natural environment” a5497b23ff

The term "protected area" also includes marine protected areas and transboundary protected areas across multiple borders. As of 2016, there are over 161,000 protected areas representing about 17 percent of the world's land surface area (excluding Antarctica). a5497b23ff The principle of the Responsibility to Protect is based upon the underlying premise that sovereignty entails a responsibility to protect all populations from mass atrocity crimes and human rights violations. The

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principle is based on respect for the norms and principles of international law, especially the underlying principles of law concerning sovereignty, peace and security, human rights, and armed conflict. The R2P has three pillars: a5497b23ff

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
