Staining Stains may be used to define biological tissues (highlighting, for example, muscle fibers or connective tissue), cell populations (classifying different blood cells), or organelles within individual cells. Extracts from *Curcuma longa* (the source of turmeric), *Beta vulgaris* (beetroot), and *Lawsonia inermis* (henna) are being actively considered and researched Staining is a technique used to enhance contrast in samples, generally at the microscopic level. Stains and dyes are frequently used in histology (microscopic study of biological tissues), in cytology (microscopic study of cells), and in the medical fields of

histopathology, hematology, and cytopathology that focus on the study and diagnoses of diseases at the microscopic level
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The scientific consensus is that the evidence showing HIV to be the cause of AIDS is conclusive and that HIV/AIDS denialist claims are pseudoscience based on conspiracy theories, faulty reasoning, cherry picking, and misrepresentation of mainly outdated scientific data.
