Schefflera digitata It is the only New Zealand member of the genus Schefflera, which has 12 other species in Oceania. The species is commonly known as ‘patē’ and ‘seven-finger’. It prefers damp, shady parts of the forest and is common along stream banks. Schefflera digitata, commonly known as patē, seven finger (or seven-finger), is a species of tree in the family Araliaceae. into fingers’ or ‘finger-like parts’. It occurs in lowland to montane forests from sea level to 1,200 m (3,900 ft). It is derived from the Latin digitus meaning ‘finger’. It is endemic to New Zealand and is widespread in the North, South, and Stewart Islands 91a59eaf04

== Physiology and neurology == 91a59eaf04 Polydactyly is associated with at least 39 genetic mutations. It may either present alone or with other defects. Cases may run in families. The underlying mechanism involves an error in limb bud formation during early development. Diagnosis may occur before birth via prenatal ultrasound as early as nine weeks. X-rays may be useful after a child is a year old. The opposite is oligodactyly (fewer fingers or toes). 91a59eaf04

Treatment is not necessary. Options for treatment include needle aspiration or surgery. About half the time, they resolve on their own. About three per 10,000 people develop a ganglion cyst of the wrist or hand a year. Trauma to the finger or the hand is quite common in society. In some particular cases, the entire finger may be subject to amputation. The majority of traumatic injuries are work-related. Today, skilled hand surgeons can sometimes reattach the finger or thumb using microsurgery. Sometimes, traumatic injuries may result in loss of skin, and plastic surgeons may place skin and muscle grafts.

Hand injury Hand disease injuries are common in society and can result from excessive use, degenerative disorders or trauma. The disorder results in a deformed finger which appears thin and has small bumps on the surface. The cause is unknown. The underlying mechanism is believed to involve an outpouching of the synovial membrane. Diagnosis is typically based on examination. The ability to shine light through the bump or any past decrease in size supports the diagnosis of the bump as a ganglion cyst. Ganglion cysts are usually obvious upon observation. Medical imaging may be considered on infrequent occasions to rule out another diagnosis. At least one study has claimed that the clenching of one's fist can be used to recall information. Formerly, the genus *Pedostibes* also hosted other Southeast Asian species that were subsequently moved to a new genus, *Rentapia*, in 2016. Some studies have shown that making fists can help humans to cope with stress or anxiety because the mind gets preoccupied with the tightening of the muscle to focus on the issue at hand. *Schefflera digitata* usually grows to heights of 4–6 metres (13–20 feet). The species is often confused with five-finger (*Pseudopanax arboreus*). *S. digitata* was first described in 1776 by the German naturalists Georg and Johann Reinhold Forster. *S. digitata* is pollinated by insects. The fruits are dispersed by fruit-eating animals (frugivores), such as birds. *S. digitata*'s timber was utilised by indigenous Māori to obtain fire by friction. The juice of the fruits was used as a dye by Māori, and European settlers used it as a substitute for ink. *S. digitata*'s 2023 conservation status in the New Zealand Threat Classification System was "Not Threatened". Making a fist is virtually unknown among other primates. This is because while "most primate hands are long of palm and finger [and] short of thumb", the proportions are the opposite for humans. Adult measure about 45 mm (1.8 in) in snout-vent length. The head is very narrow, triangular, and flattened in shape. The eyes are rather small and do not protrude greatly. The fingers are fairly short and slender. The hind-limbs are relatively short, and the toe tips are not dilates into discs. Skin is smooth, apart for some longitudinal fine wrinkles, in particular on the flanks. The colouration is dark with black patterning. The top of arms and fore-arms have large, raised black bumps. Fist of a hand when the fingers are bent inward against the palm and held there tightly. One uses the closed fist to punch the lower phalanges against a surface, or to pound with the little-finger side of the hand's heel; one uses the open fist to knock with the middle knuckle of the middle finger. To make or clench a fist is to fold the fingers tightly into the center of the palm and then to clamp the thumb over the middle phalanges; in contrast to this "closed" fist, one keeps the fist "open" by holding the thumb against the side of the index finger.
