There are several kinds, belonging to traditional medicine, alternative medicine, and some newer kind of medicine under investigation. The original, unscientific form is "the immediate intramuscular or subcutaneous reinjection of freshly drawn autologous blood" f1edf88354

The cause of Bell's palsy is unknown and it can occur at any age. Risk factors include diabetes, a recent upper respiratory tract infection, and pregnancy. It results from a

dysfunction of cranial nerve VII (the facial nerve). Many believe that this is due to a viral infection that results in swelling. Diagnosis is based on a person's appearance and ruling out other possible causes. Forehead The top of the forehead is marked by the hairline, the edge of the area where hair on the scalp grows. The bottom of the forehead is marked by the supraorbital ridge, the bone feature of the skull above the eyes. The two sides of the forehead are marked by the temporal ridge, a bone feature that links the supraorbital ridge to the coronal suture line and beyond. However, the eyebrows do not form part of the forehead. One part In human anatomy, the forehead is an area of the head bounded by three features, two of the skull and one of the scalp. The ophthalmic branch of the trigeminal nerve, the supraorbital nerve, divides at the orbital rim into two parts in the forehead. facial nerve f1edf88354

Bell's palsy Symptoms can vary from mild to severe. Typically symptoms come on over 48 hours. Bell's palsy is a type of facial paralysis that results in a temporary inability to control the facial muscles on the affected side of the face. Other symptoms include drooping of the eyebrow, a change in taste, and pain around the ear. They may include muscle twitching, weakness, or total loss of the ability to move one or, in rare cases, both sides of the face. In most cases, the weakness is temporary and significantly improves over weeks. In most cases Bell's palsy is a type of facial paralysis that results in a temporary inability to control the facial muscles on the affected side of the face. Bell's palsy can trigger an increased sensitivity to sound known as hyperacusis f1edf88354

Inferior alveolar nerve anaesthesia However, depending on technique, the long buccal nerve may not be anesthetized by an IANB and therefore an area of buccal gingiva adjacent to the lower posterior teeth will retain normal sensation unless that nerve is anesthetized separately, via a (long) buccal nerve block. of the mouth and face innervated by one of the inferior alveolar nerves which are paired on the left and right side. These areas are the skin and mucous membranes of the lower lip, the skin of the chin, the lower teeth and the labial gingiva of the anterior teeth, all unilaterally to the midline of the side on which the block is administered. These areas are the skin and mucous Inferior alveolar nerve block (abbreviated to IANB, and also termed inferior alveolar nerve anesthesia or inferior dental block) is a nerve block technique which induces anesthesia (numbness) in the areas of the

mouth and face innervated by one of the inferior alveolar nerves which are paired on the left and right side. This procedure attempts to anaesthetise the inferior alveolar nerve prior to it entering the mandibular foramen on the medial surface of the mandibular ramus. The inferior alveolar nerve is a branch of the mandibular nerve, the third division of the trigeminal nerve f1edf88354

The other forms involve some change to the blood before it is reinjected, typically oxygenation, ozonation (ozonated autohemotherapy), ultraviolet light exposure, or centrifugation. Forms include platelet-rich plasma (PRP), and autologous conditioned serum (ACS). f1edf88354

Fluocinolone/hydroquinone/tretinoin disease. Some patients using Tri-Luma Cream develop dark spots on their skin, tingling, increased skin sensitivity, rash, acne, skin redness caused by f1edf88354
