A common use is route planning, which enables users to find their way to their destination. Scientists use maps to organize spatial data in fields such as geology, meteorology, seismology and demographics. Governments use maps for administrative functions such as census, electoral districts, property taxation, dispatching police, and coordinating disaster relief. Specialized maps, called charts, are used for nautical navigation (nautical charts) and aviation (aeronautical charts). Maps are used for a wide range of purposes, including navigation, scientific research, governance, and warfare. Military and security organizations use maps for mission planning, surveillance, border management, logistics, and intelligence analysis 54e8993d38

The term autecology (from Ancient Greek: αὐτο, aúto, "self"; οἶκος, oíkos, "household"; and λόγος, lógos, "knowledge"), refers to roughly the same field of study as concepts such as life cycles and behaviour as adaptations to the environment by individual organisms. In 1946 Thomas Park credited four individuals with establishing the modern view of population ecology: Carl Semper for noting... 54e8993d38 Cartograms leverage the fact that size is the most intuitive visual variable for representing a total amount. In this, it is a strategy that is similar to proportional symbol maps, which scale point features, and many flow maps, which scale the weight of linear features. However, these two techniques only scale the map symbol, not space itself; a map that stretches the length of linear features is considered a linear cartogram (although additional flow map techniques may be added). Once constructed,
