Allotransplantation of a tooth involves it being transferred from one individual to another individual of the same species. It is a largely defunct practice due to the improvements made within the field of dentistry and due to the risks and complications involved including the transmission of diseases such as syphilis, histocompatibility, as well as the low success rate of the procedure, has resulted in its practice being largely abandoned. The periodontium is cultivated for food, such as the Japanese bunching onion *Allium fistulosum*, the tree onion *Allium × proliferum*, and the Canada onion *Allium canadense*. The name wild onion is applied to a number of *Allium* species, but *A. cepa* is exclusively known from cultivation. Its ancestral wild original form is not known, although escapes from cultivation have become established in some regions. The onion is most frequently a biennial or a perennial plant, but is usually treated as an annual and harvested in its first growing season.

extraction, exodontia, exodontics, or informally, tooth pulling) is the removal of teeth from the dental alveolus (socket) in the alveolar bone. Sometimes impacted wisdom teeth (wisdom teeth that are stuck and unable to grow normally into the mouth) cause recurrent infections of the gum (pericoronitis), and may be removed when other conservative treatments have failed (cleaning, antibiotics and operculectomy). In orthodontics, if the teeth are crowded, healthy teeth may be extracted (often bicuspids) to create space so the rest of the teeth can be straightened

== Botany == Species of *Kambara* are easiest differentiated by the different occlusal patterns of their teeth. While *K. murgonensis* had an overbite similar to a modern alligator, both *K. implexidens* and *K. taraina* had interlocking dentition much more similar to true crocodiles. *K. molnari*, although incompletely known, seems to represent an intermediate form. Common causes include inflammation of the pulp (usually in response to tooth decay, dental trauma, or other factors), dentin hypersensitivity, apical periodontitis (inflammation of the periodontal ligament and alveolar bone around the root apex), dental abscesses (localized collections of pus), alveolar osteitis ("dry socket", a possible complication of tooth extraction), acute necrotizing ulcerative gingivitis (a gum infection), and temporomandibular disorder. requires a very small fracture space or some sort of scaffold to do so. Bone grafts may be autologous (bone harvested from the patient's own body, often from the iliac crest), allograft (cadaveric bone usually obtained from a bone bank), or synthetic (often made of hydroxyapatite or other naturally occurring and biocompatible substances) with similar mechanical properties to bone. Most bone grafts are expected to be resorbed and replaced as the natural bone heals over a few months' time. 4c00ee5d40

Impacted wisdom teeth Completely unerupted wisdom teeth usually result in no symptoms, although they can sometimes develop cysts or neoplasms. It can be 4 to 6 weeks **Impacted wisdom teeth** is a condition where the third molars (wisdom teeth) are prevented from erupting into the mouth. Removal of impacted wisdom teeth is advised for the future prevention of or in the current presence of certain pathologies, such as caries (dental decay), periodontal disease or cysts. However, in recent decades the preventive removal of impacted wisdom teeth has come into question, and some health organizations have issued guidelines calling to only remove impacted wisdom teeth in the case of. **Partially erupted wisdom teeth** or wisdom teeth that are not erupted but are exposed to oral bacteria through deep periodontal pocket, can develop cavities or pericoronitis. This can be caused by a physical barrier, such as other teeth, or when the tooth is angled away from a vertical position. Prophylactic (preventative) extraction of wisdom teeth is preferred to be done at a younger age (middle to late teenage years) to take advantage of incomplete root development, which is associated with an easier surgical procedure and less probability of complications. to about 25% by post-operative day 7 unless affected by dry socket: a disorder of wound healing that prolongs post-operative pain 4c00ee5d40
