It has the same root as the adjective μακρός (makros), meaning "long" or "tall" in Ancient Greek. The name is originally believed to have meant either "highlanders", "the tall ones", or "high grown men".

The Baynton has been occupied by Aboriginal people for thousands of years, and was the approximate meeting point of lands inhabited by the Dja Dja Wurrung, Taungurong, and Woiwurrung peoples.
