== Background == With the intention of controlling the spread of the disease, public rights of way across land were closed by order. Aphthovirus of FMD in endemic areas has been difficult, despite the availability of a vaccine. There are seven FMDV serotypes: A, O, C, SAT 1, SAT 2, SAT 3 and Asia 1, and four non-FMDV serotypes belonging to three additional species Bovine rhinitis A virus (BRAV), Bovine rhinitis B virus (BRBV) and Equine rhinitis A virus (ERAV). Equine rhinitis A virus (ERAV) was first isolated from horses in the Aphthovirus (from the Greek ἄφθα, aphtha, 'vesicles in the mouth') is a viral genus of the family Picornaviridae. Susceptible animals include cattle, water buffalo, sheep, goats, pigs, antelope, deer, and bison. It has also been known to infect hedgehogs and elephants; llamas and alpacas may develop mild symptoms, but are resistant to the disease and do not pass it on to others of the same species. Its containment demands considerable efforts in vaccination, strict monitoring, trade restrictions, quarantines,

and the culling of both infected and healthy (uninfected) animals.

Japan foot-and-mouth outbreak The Miyazaki FMD Control The Japan foot-and-mouth outbreak in 2010 occurred in Miyazaki Prefecture, affecting cattle, swine, sheep and goats. A similar outbreak had occurred ten years earlier, in 2000. The number of livestock killed was 297,808, and the estimated economic loss was 235 billion yen. The following day, the infected cattle were slaughtered.
