Atomoxetine Use of atomoxetine is only recommended for those who are at least six years old. Estrogens and progestogens are the main hormone drugs used in HRT. Although both classes of hormones can have symptomatic benefit, progestogen is specifically added to estrogen regimens, unless the uterus has been removed, to avoid the increased risk of endometrial cancer. Unopposed estrogen therapy promotes endometrial hyperplasia and increases the risk of cancer, while progestogen reduces this risk. Androgens like testosterone are sometimes used as well.
