Uterus). The uterus is a hormone-responsive sex organ that contains glands in its lining that secrete uterine milk for embryonic nourishment. == Ovarian serous tumours == f13614c213 Uterine contractions that occur throughout the menstrual cycle, also termed endometrial waves or contractile waves, appear to involve only the sub-endometrial layer of the myometrium. f13614c213

Uterine contraction 10–15 seconds with a low intensity of usually 30 mmHg or less. The frequency Uterine contractions are muscle contractions of the uterine smooth muscle that can occur at various intensities in both the non-pregnant and pregnant uterine state. This sub-endometrial layer is rich in estrogen and progesterone receptors. The non-pregnant uterus undergoes small, spontaneous contractions in addition to stronger, coordinated contractions during the menstrual cycle and orgasm f13614c213

Serous tumour They are common neoplasms with a strong tendency to occur bilaterally, and they account for approximately a quarter of all ovarian tumors. This case closely resembles normal surface endometrial epithelium of the uterus. They typically arise on the modified Müllerian-derived serous membranes that surround the ovaries in females. Such ovarian tumors are part of the surface epithelial-stromal tumour group of ovarian tumors. admixed scattered ciliated cells. Rarely, serous tumors arise from other parts of the peritoneum, including serous primary peritoneal carcinomas. Even more rarely they arise in other body locations, such as the lungs. Despite the name, uterine serous carcinoma arises from the endometrium and not the serous membrane. f13614c213 Other sources reserve... f13614c213 Throughout gestation, the uterus enters a state of uterine quiescence due to various neural and hormonal changes. During this state, the uterus undergoes little to no contractions, though spontaneous contractions still occur for the uterine myocyte cells to experience hypertrophy. The pregnant uterus only contracts strongly during orgasms, labour, and in the postpartum stage to return to its natural size. f13614c213 HNPPC is synonymous with Lynch syndrome, an autosomal dominant genetic condition that is most commonly associated with a high risk of colon cancer and secondarily most associated with endometrial cancer, as well as ovarian, stomach, small intestine, hepatobiliary tract, upper urinary tract, brain, and skin cancers. The increased risk for these cancers is due to inherited genetic mutations that impair DNA mismatch repair. The presence of endometriosis can result in the formation of scar tissue, adhesions and an inflammatory reaction. f13614c213 EIN should not be confused with an unrelated entity, serous intraepithelial carcinoma ("serous EIC"), which is an early stage of a different tumor type known as papillary serous adenocarcinoma... f13614c213 Approximately 40% of cases are related to obesity. Endometrial cancer is also associated with excessive estrogen exposure, high blood pressure and diabetes. Whereas taking estrogen alone increases the risk of endometrial cancer, taking both estrogen and a progestogen in combination, as in most birth control pills, decreases the risk. Between two and five percent of cases are related to genes inherited from the parents. Endometrial cancer is sometimes called "uterine cancer", although it is distinct from other forms of cancer of the uterus such as cervical cancer, uterine sarcoma, and trophoblastic disease. The most frequent type of endometrial cancer is endometrioid carcinoma, which accounts for more than 80% of cases. Endometrial cancer is commonly diagnosed... f13614c213 In adenomyosis, basal endometrium penetrates into hyperplastic myometrial fibers. Unlike the functional layer, the basal layer does not undergo typical cyclic changes with the menstrual cycle. Adenomyosis may involve the uterus focally, creating an adenomyoma. With diffuse involvement, the uterus becomes bulky and heavier. f13614c213

Endometrial cancer It is the result of the abnormal growth of cells that can invade or spread to other parts of the body. Other symptoms include pain with urination, pain during sexual intercourse, or pelvic pain. Regular screening in those at normal risk is not called for. The leading treatment option for endometrial cancer is abdominal Endometrial cancer is a cancer that arises from the endometrium (the lining of the uterus or womb). sufficient to show endometrial cancer. Endometrial cancer occurs most commonly after menopause. The first sign is most often vaginal bleeding not associated with a menstrual period f13614c213

Endometrium The endometrium was historically seen as sterile, but is now known to have a microbial community. It has a basal layer and a functional layer: the basal layer contains stem cells which regenerate the functional layer. Vascular spaces fuse and become interconnected, forming the placenta, which supplies oxygen and nutrition to the embryo and fetus. In the uterus, simple tubular glands reach from the endometrial surface through to the The endometrium is the inner lining of the uterus (womb) in mammals. tissue that varies in thickness according to hormonal influences. During pregnancy, the glands and blood vessels in the endometrium further increase in size and number. In most other mammals, the endometrium is reabsorbed in the estrous cycle. The functional layer thickens and then is shed during menstruation in humans and some other mammals, including other apes, Old World monkeys, some species of bat, the elephant shrew and the Cairo spiny mouse f13614c213

== Structure == f13614c213 The condition is typically found in women between the ages of 35 and 50, but also affects younger women. Patients with adenomyosis often present with painful menses (dysmenorrhea), profuse menses (menorrhagia), or both. Other possible symptoms are pain during sexual intercourse, chronic pelvic pain and irritation of the urinary bladder. f13614c213 Henry T. Lynch, Professor of Medicine at Creighton University Medical Center, characterized the syndrome in 1966. In his earlier work, he described the disease entity as "cancer family syndrome." The term "Lynch syndrome" was coined in 1984 by other

authors; Lynch named the condition HNPCC in 1985. Since then, the two terms have been used interchangeably until later advances in the understanding of the genetics of the disease led to the term HNPCC falling out of favor. f13614c213 In humans, the lower end of the uterus is a narrow part known as the isthmus that connects to the cervix, the anterior gateway leading to the vagina. The upper end, the body of the uterus, is connected to the fallopian tubes at the uterine horns; the rounded part, the fundus, is above the openings to the fallopian tubes. The connection of the uterine cavity with a fallopian tube is called the uterotubal junction. The fertilized egg is carried to the uterus along the fallopian tube. It will have divided on its journey to form a blastocyst that will implant itself into the lining of the uterus – the endometrium, where it will receive nutrients and develop into the embryo proper, and later fetus, for the duration of the pregnancy... f13614c213 BMI values under 20 and over 25 have been associated with higher all-cause mortality, with the risk increasing with distance from the 20-25 interval. f13614c213

The tissue thickens Adenomyosis is a medical condition characterized by the growth of cells that proliferate on the inside of the uterus (endometrium) atypically located among the cells of the uterine wall (myometrium), as a result, thickening of the uterus occurs. They are a subset of a larger mixed group of lesions previously called "endometrial hyperplasia". The EIN diagnostic schema is intended to replace the previous "endometrial hyperplasia" classification as defined by the World Health Organization in 1994, which have been separated into benign (benign endometrial hyperplasia) and premalignant (EIN) classes in accordance with their behavior and clinical management. f13614c213 Other HNPCC conditions include Lynch-like syndrome, polymerase proofreading-associated polyposis, and familial colorectal cancer type X. f13614c213 Endometriomas are usually benign growths, most often found in the ovary. They form dark, fluid-filled cysts, which can vary greatly in size. The fluid inside the cysts is thick, dark, old blood that resembles the color of chocolate, giving it the name chocolate cyst. It can also develop in the cul-de-sac (the space behind the uterus), the surface of the uterus, and between the vagina and rectum. f13614c213 The BMI is a convenient rule of thumb used to broadly categorize a person based on tissue mass (muscle, fat, and bone) and height. Major adult BMI classifications are: underweight (under 18.5), normal weight (18.5 to 24.9), overweight (25 to 29.9), and obese (30 or more). When used to predict an individual's health, rather than as a statistical measurement for groups, the BMI has limitations that can make it less useful than some of the alternatives, especially when applied to individuals with abdominal obesity, short stature, or high muscle mass. f13614c213
