Valvular heart disease These conditions occur largely as a consequence of aging, but may also be the result of congenital (inborn) abnormalities or specific disease or physiologic processes including rheumatic heart disease and pregnancy. of advance age. Aortic stenosis due to calcification Valvular heart disease is any cardiovascular disease process involving one or more of the four valves of the heart (the aortic and mitral valves on the left side of heart and the pulmonic and tricuspid valves on the right side of heart). Aortic stenosis due to calcification of tricuspid aortic valve with age comprises >50% of the disease

During the late 1940s and early 1950s, the first surgical approaches towards treating aortic valve stenosis had limited success. The first attempts were valvotomies, (i.e. cutting the valve while the heart is pumping). A ball valve prosthesis placed on the descending thoracic aorta (heterotopically) was developed by Hufnagel, Harvey and others to address aortic stenosis, but had disastrous complications. Aortic stenosis Loss of consciousness typically occurs with standing or exercising. Typical symptoms are shortness of breath on exertion, chest pain (angina) and dizziness or blackouts on exertion (syncope). Signs of heart failure include shortness of breath especially when lying down, at night, or with. Much more rarely stenosis can occur below the aortic valve or above it. Aortic stenosis typically Aortic stenosis (AS or AoS) is the narrowing of the outlet of the main pumping chamber of the heart, the left ventricle (LV) (where the aorta begins). If the narrowing is severe (very tight) the extra work required from the left ventricle to pump the blood against the increased resistance of a small orifice may cause (initially adaptive) thickening of the heart muscle, followed by severe weakness of the heart (heart failure). If heart failure, loss of consciousness, or heart related chest pain occur due to AS, the outcomes are worse, with mortality of 50% at 2-5 years in the absence of valve replacement. They often come on gradually, with a decreased ability to exercise often occurring first. Aortic stenosis typically gets worse over time. The most common form of AS involves the aortic valve, which separates the LV from the aorta. Severe symptomatic aortic stenosis carries a poor prognosis. At present, there is no treatment via medication, making the timing of aortic valve replacement the most important decision to make for these patients. Until recently, surgical aortic valve replacement was the standard treatment for adults with severe symptomatic aortic stenosis. Transcatheter aortic valve replacement The first TAVI Transcatheter aortic valve replacement (TAVR), or transcatheter aortic valve implantation (TAVI), is the implantation of a replacement for the aortic valve through the blood vessels and into the heart, without removing the native valve. The first TAVI was performed on 16 April 2002 by Alain Cribier. alternative to surgical aortic valve replacement (SAVR), which requires open heart surgery. TAVR procedure is used to treat severe aortic stenosis. TAVR procedure is used to treat severe aortic stenosis. The implanted valve is delivered via one of several access methods: transfemoral (in the upper leg), transapical (through the wall of the heart), subclavian (beneath the collar bone), direct aortic (through a minimally invasive surgical incision into the aorta), and transcaval (from a temporary hole in the aorta near the navel through a vein in the upper leg), among others. TAVR is an alternative to surgical aortic valve replacement (SAVR), which requires open heart surgery 60e4face32

Anatomically, the valves are part of the dense connective tissue of the heart known as the cardiac skeleton and are responsible for the regulation of blood flow through the heart and great vessels. Valve failure or dysfunction can result in diminished heart functionality, though the particular consequences are dependent on the type and severity of valvular disease. Treatment of damaged valves may involve medication alone, but often involves surgical valve repair or valve replacement. 60e4face32

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
