The most appropriate method of biopsy for a patient depends upon a variety of factors, including the size, location, appearance and characteristics of the abnormality. Breast biopsies can be done utilizing ultrasound, MRI or a stereotactic biopsy imaging

guidance. Needle biopsies have largely replaced open surgical biopsies in the initial assessment of imaging as well as palpable abnormalities in the breast. On average, 5–10 biopsies of a suspicious breast lesion will lead to the diagnosis of one case of breast cancer. Vacuum assisted biopsies are typically done using stereotactic techniques when the suspicious lesion can only be seen on mammography 7604d01140

Miliary tuberculosis can also present with enlarged liver (40% of cases), enlarged spleen (15%), inflammation of the pancreas (<5%), and multiple organ dysfunction with adrenal insufficiency (adrenal glands do not produce enough steroid hormones to regulate organ function). Miliary tuberculosis Miliary TB may infect any number of organs, including the lungs, liver, and spleen. The tuberculosis (TB) Miliary tuberculosis is a form of tuberculosis, characterized by a wide dissemination into the human body, with small lesions looking like millet seeds (1–5 mm). Its name comes from a distinctive pattern seen on a chest radiograph of many tiny spots distributed throughout the lung fields with the appearance similar to millet seeds—thus the term miliary tuberculosis. include chest x-ray, sputum culture, bronchoscopy, open lung biopsy, head CT/MRI, blood cultures, fundoscopy, and electrocardiography 7604d01140

Medical imaging Medical imaging also establishes a database of normal anatomy and physiology to make it possible to identify abnormalities. For example Medical imaging is the technique and process of imaging the interior of a body for clinical analysis and medical intervention, as well as visual representation of the function

of some organs or tissues (physiology). Medical imaging seeks to reveal internal structures hidden by the skin and bones, as well as to diagnose and treat disease. T1-weighted (T1-MRI), T2-weighted (T2-MRI), diffusion-weighted imaging (DWI-MRI), dynamic contrast enhancement (DCE-MRI), and spectroscopy (MRI-S). Although imaging of removed organs and tissues can be performed for medical reasons, such procedures are usually considered part of pathology instead of medical imaging 7604d01140

Treatment depends on the severity of the symptoms, with mild cases possibly only requiring rest and localized icing. MRIs are used A coma (from Ancient Greek κῶμα koma 'deep sleep') is a prolonged state of deep unconsciousness in which a person cannot be awakened, fails to respond normally to stimuli (including pain, light, and sound), lacks a normal sleep-wake cycle and does not initiate voluntary actions. The person may experience respiratory and circulatory problems due to the body's inability to maintain normal bodily functions. Spinal disease MRI scans and muscle biopsies used to be the standard testing method, but molecular Spinal disease refers to a condition impairing the backbone. Dorsalgia refers to back pain. Some other spinal diseases include spinal muscular atrophy, ankylosing
