Broad-spectrum antibiotic Although powerful, broad-spectrum antibiotics pose specific risks, particularly the disruption of native, normal bacteria and the development of antimicrobial resistance. This is in contrast to a narrow-spectrum antibiotic, which is effective against only a specific group of bacteria. An example of a commonly used broad-spectrum antibiotic is ampicillin. These medications are used when a bacterial infection is suspected but the group of bacteria is unknown (also called empiric therapy) or when infection with multiple groups of bacteria is suspected. sarecycline) Chloramphenicol Ticarcillin Trimethoprim/sulfamethoxazole (Bactrim) Ofloxacin In veterinary medicine, co-amoxiclav, (in small animals); penicillin A broad-spectrum antibiotic is an antibiotic that acts on the two major bacterial groups, Gram-positive and Gram-negative, or any antibiotic that acts against a wide range of disease-causing bacteria 423f7dacc9

Antibiotics are often grouped by their ability to act on different bacterial groups. Although bacteria are biologically classified using taxonomy, disease-causing bacteria have historically been classified by their microscopic appearance and chemical function. Vesicoureteral reflux The valve is formed by oblique tunneling of the distal ureter through the wall of the bladder, creating a short length of ureter (1-2 cm) that can be compressed as the bladder fills. increases risk of acute bladder and kidney infections, so testing for reflux may be performed after a child has one or more infections. In infants, the signs Vesicoureteral reflux (VUR), also known as vesicoureteric reflux, is a condition in which urine flows retrograde, or backward, from the bladder into one or both ureters and then to the renal calyx or kidneys. Reflux occurs if the ureter enters the bladder without sufficient tunneling, i. e. Urine normally travels in one direction (forward, or anterograde) from the kidneys to the bladder via the ureters, with a one-way valve at the vesicoureteral (ureteral-bladder) junction preventing backflow. , too "end-on" 423f7dacc9
