Proton-pump inhibitors have largely superseded the H₂-receptor antagonists, a group of medications with similar effects but a different mode of action, and heavy use of antacids. Potassium-competitive acid blockers (PCABs) have entered the market since the 2010s.

Adenosine diphosphate receptor inhibitor They belong to G protein-coupled purinergic receptors (GPCR) and are chemoreceptors for ADP. The P2Y₁₂ receptor is a surface bound protein found on blood platelets. All proton pump inhibitors except for rabeprazole and pantoprazole are metabolized by the hepatic CYP450 enzyme and therefore Adenosine diphosphate (ADP) receptor inhibitors are a drug class of antiplatelet agents, used in the treatment of acute coronary syndrome (ACS) or in preventive treatment for patients who are in risk of thromboembolism, myocardial infarction or a stroke. and reduce clopidogrel activity. These drugs antagonize the P2Y₁₂ platelet receptors and therefore prevent the binding of ADP to the P2Y₁₂ receptor. This leads to a decrease in aggregation of platelets, prohibiting thrombus formation

Rabeprazole It is taken by mouth. Effectiveness is similar to other proton pump inhibitors (PPIs). It may also be used in combination with other medications to treat Helicobacter pylori. It is used to treat peptic ulcer disease, gastroesophageal reflux disease, and excess stomach acid production such as in Zollinger-Ellison syndrome. studies on rabbits with rabeprazole doses of up to 50 mg/kg/day (about 13 times the normal human drug exposure of rabeprazole at 20 mg) failed to show evidence Rabeprazole, sold under the brand name Aciphex, among others, is a medication that decreases stomach acid

The first drug introduced in this class was ticlopidine but due to adverse effects it is not much used today. Ticlopidine, clopidogrel and prasugrel (Efient) are all thienopyridines that cause irreversible inhibition of P2Y₁₂ receptor. They are all prodrugs which need to be converted to an active metabolite in-vivo to inhibit the P2Y₁₂ receptor. On the other hand, novel drugs like ticagrelor (Brilinta®) and cangrelor (Kengrexal®) are non-thienopyridines and reversibly inhibit P2Y₁₂ meaning they act directly on the receptor without the requirement of metabolic activation and...

Troxipide It is used for the management of gastric ulcers, and amelioration of gastric mucosal lesions in acute gastritis and acute exacerbation of chronic gastritis. CYP2C19 CYP2C19 is a liver enzyme that acts on at least 10% of drugs in current clinical use, among them the antiplatelet treatment clopidogrel (Plavix), drugs that treat pain associated with ulcers, such as omeprazole, antiseizure drugs such as mephenytoin, the antimalarial proguanil, and the anxiolytic diazepam. It is a member of the CYP2C subfamily of the cytochrome P450 mixed-function oxidase system. In humans, it is the CYP2C19 gene that encodes the CYP2C19 protein. These proteins are monooxygenases Cytochrome P450 2C19 (abbreviated CYP2C19) is an enzyme protein. This subfamily includes enzymes that catalyze metabolism of xenobiotics, including some proton pump inhibitors and antiepileptic drugs. Literature from anaesthetic screenings led attention to the potential antiviral compound pyridylthioacetamide which after further examination pointed the focus on an anti-secretory compound with unknown mechanisms of action called timoprazole. Timoprazole is a pyridylmethylsulfinyl benzimidazole and appealed due to its simple chemical structure and its surprisingly high level of anti-secretory activity. 09c1a655fa Side effects may include headache, anxiety, dry mouth, abdominal cramps, diarrhea, and elevated prolactin levels. Secondary to increased prolactin levels, breast changes, milk outflow, menstrual irregularities, and hypogonadism can occur. Domperidone may also cause QT prolongation and has rarely been associated with serious cardiac complications such as sudden cardiac death. However, the risks are small and occur more with high doses. Domperidone acts as a peripherally selective antagonist of the dopamine D2 and D3 receptors. Due to its low entry into the brain, the side effects of domperidone are different from those of other dopamine receptor antagonists like metoclopramide and it produces little in the way of central nervous system adverse effects. Discovery and development of proton pump inhibitors Rabeprazole (brand names: Zechin, Rabecid, Nzole-D, AcipHex, Pariet, Rabeloc, Zulfex, Ontime, Noflux) Rabeprazole is a novel benzimidazole Proton pump inhibitors (PPIs) block the gastric hydrogen potassium ATPase (H⁺/K⁺ ATPase) and inhibit gastric acid secretion. These drugs have emerged as the treatment of choice for acid-related diseases, including gastroesophageal reflux disease (GERD) and peptic ulcer disease. for intravenous use 09c1a655fa

Trimebutine It is sometimes combined with simethicone as a combination drug. Trimebutine is formulated as a tablet or granules for oral suspension.
