Some laboratories do not Urinalysis, a portmanteau of the words urine and analysis, is a panel of medical tests that includes physical (macroscopic) examination of the urine, chemical evaluation using urine test strips, and microscopic examination. Macroscopic examination targets parameters such as color, clarity, odor, and specific gravity; urine test strips measure chemical properties such as pH, glucose concentration, and protein levels; and microscopy is performed to identify elements such as cells, urinary casts, crystals, and organisms 09fd4ceca4

It can be part of a broader urinalysis. recommended when blood in the urine (hematuria) has been detected. If a cancerous condition is detected, other tests and procedures are usually recommended to diagnose cancers, including bladder cancer, ureteral cancer and cancer of the urethra. The test commonly checks for infection, inflammatory disease of the urinary tract, cancer, or precancerous conditions. It is especially recommended

The test strips consist of a ribbon made of plastic or paper of about 5 millimetre wide. Plastic strips have pads impregnated with chemicals that react with the compounds present in urine producing a characteristic colour. For the paper strips the reactants are absorbed directly onto the paper. Paper strips are often specific to a single reaction (e.g. pH measurement), while the strips with pads allow several...

Human urine and feces, called human waste or human excreta, are managed via sanitation systems. Livestock urine and feces also require proper management if the livestock population density is high. creates an osmotic barrier: urine osmotic concentration can range from 50 to 1200 mmol/L while the normal concentration is 290 mmol/L. The difference between the two could lead to fluid entering or exiting the ureter due to the osmotic pressure. Urine plays an important role in the earth's nitrogen cycle. In balanced ecosystems, urine fertilizes the soil and thus helps plants to grow. Therefore, urine can be used as a fertilizer. Some animals mark their territories with urine. Historically, aged or fermented urine (known as lant) was also used in gunpowder production, household cleaning, leather tanning, and textile dyeing. Amiloride – better tolerated than triamterene For this process, urine must be collected in a reliable fashion, and if urine samples are inadequate, the urinary tract can be assessed via instrumentation, such as a catheter. In urine cytology, collected urine is examined microscopically.

tight junctions which: prevents urine from leaking through Umbrella cells (also known as facet cells, capping cells, and superficial urotheliocytes) are a type of cells located in the bladder, the renal pelvis, the ureters, and the urethra. Their apical membrane contains numerous invaginations, which allows the cells to stretch during urination 09fd4ceca4

Umbrella cells contain the proteins uroplakin-1a uroplakin-1b, uroplakin-2, and uroplakin-3a. These increase the strength of the urothelium. 09fd4ceca4 A standard urine test strip may comprise up to 10 different chemical pads or reagents which react (change color) when immersed in, and then removed from, a urine sample. The test can often be read in as little as 60 to 120 seconds after dipping, although certain tests require longer. Routine testing of the urine with multiparameter strips is the first step in the diagnosis of a wide range of diseases. Potassium-sparing diuretic They are typically used as an adjunct in management of hypertension, cirrhosis, and congestive heart failure. This occurs via epithelial sodium channels or ENaCs, located on the luminal surface of principal cells that Potassium-sparing diuretics or antikaliuretics refer to drugs that cause diuresis without causing potassium loss in the urine. in the collecting tubules of a renal nephron. Spironolactone, a steroidal aldosterone antagonist, is also used in management of female hirsutism and acne from PCOS or other causes. The steroidal aldosterone antagonists can also be used for treatment of primary hyperaldosteronism 09fd4ceca4

Urethra : urethras or urethrae) is the tube that transports urine from the bladder to the urethral meatus of the penis or vulva in placental mammals. otherwise normal, except in late disease. In males, it also transports semen through the penis during ejaculation. Cancer of the urethra is most often due to cancer of the cells lining the urethra, called transitional cell carcinoma The urethra (pl 09fd4ceca4

The clinical manifestation is similar to neurogenic diabetes insipidus, presenting with polydipsia (excessive thirst) and polyuria (excretion of a large amount of dilute urine). Dehydration is common, and incontinence can occur secondary to chronic bladder distension. On investigation, there will be an increased plasma

osmolarity and decreased urine osmolarity. As pituitary function is normal, antidiuretic hormone levels are likely to be abnormal or raised. Polyuria will continue as long as the patient is able to drink. If the patient is unable to drink and is still unable to concentrate the...

Urine typically contains epithelial cells shed from the urinary tract, and urine cytology evaluates this urinary sediment for the presence of cancerous cells from the lining of the urinary tract, and it is a convenient noninvasive technique for follow-up analysis of patients treated for urinary tract cancers.

The urethra is a fibrous and muscular tube which connects the urinary bladder to the external urethral meatus. Its length differs between the sexes, because it passes through the penis in males.

The external urethral sphincter is a striated muscle that allows voluntary control over urination. The internal urethral sphincter, formed by the involuntary smooth muscles lining the bladder neck and urethra, is innervated by the sympathetic division of the autonomic nervous system in males and females.

In younger patients, the disease is characterized by renal hyperperfusion, glomerular hypertrophy, and glomerular hyperfiltration. Some of these individuals eventually develop a glomerulopathy leading to glomerular proteinuria (present in as many as 30%) and, in some, the nephrotic syndrome.

Co-inheritance of microdeletions in the α -globin gene (thalassemia) appear to protect against the development of nephropathy and are associated with lower mean arterial pressure and less protein in the urine.

In mammals, urine travels from the kidneys via the ureters to the bladder for storage until urination. Placental mammals expel urine from the bladder through the urethra, whereas other vertebrates urinate through the cloaca.

Nephrogenic diabetes insipidus This is in contrast to central or neurogenic diabetes insipidus, which is caused by insufficient levels of vasopressin (also called antidiuretic hormone, ADH). Nephrogenic diabetes insipidus is caused by an improper response of the kidney to vasopressin (AVP), leading to a decrease in the ability of the kidney to concentrate the urine by removing free water. collecting duct principal cells, thereby reducing lithium entry into these cells and reducing lithium's downstream effects on urine

concentrating mechanisms Nephrogenic diabetes insipidus (NDI), also known as arginine vasopressin resistance (AVP-R) and previously known as renal diabetes insipidus, is a form of diabetes insipidus primarily due to pathology of the kidney 09fd4ceca4

Though the hemoglobin can be reabsorbed in the proximal Sickle cell nephropathy is a type of kidney disease associated with sickle cell disease which causes kidney complications as a result of sickling of red blood cells in the small blood vessels. The hypertonic and relatively hypoxic environment of the renal medulla, coupled with the slower blood flow in the vasa recta, favors sickling of red blood cells, with resultant local infarction (papillary necrosis). Functional tubule defects in patients with sickle cell disease are likely the result of partial ischemic injury to the renal tubules 09fd4ceca4
