In many jurisdictions, the use of emergency lights may afford... f05aa192bb Emergency vehicle lighting refers to any of several visual warning devices, which may be known as lightbars or beacons, fitted to a vehicle and used when the driver wishes to convey to other road users the urgency of their journey, to provide additional warning of a hazard when stationary, or in the case of law enforcement as a means of signalling another motorist that a traffic stop is being initiated. These lights may be dedicated emergency lights, such as a beacon or a lightbar, or modified stock lighting, such as a wig-wag or hideaway light, and are

additional to any standard lighting on the car such as hazard lights. The first Ford Model T used carbide lamps for headlights and oil lamps for tail lights. It did not have all-electric lighting as a standard feature until several years after its introduction. == History ==
The first beacon was developed and installed in 2000 in Tucson, Arizona by R. B. Nassi, a then-transportation administrator for the city. He was inspired after a trip to Bristol in South West England where he saw a pelican crossing, he developed a prototype and his wife suggested the abbreviation HAWK. Prior to its full implementation, the HAWK beacon was categorized as an experimental device. At the time, United States transportation agencies that wanted to use the HAWK signal were required to obtain interim approval from the Federal...
Summary
Mechanical signalling in all States followed British practice using route signalling with slight differences between States. The basic running signal was the Home signal, an

absolute stop signal with a red arm. Route signalling was used to indicate the line to be taken at junctions. Advance warning was given by a Distant signals. Subsidiary signals for shunting moves differed between States, just as they did between the different railway companies in Britain.

Red, yellow, and blue are also commonly taught as primary colors (usually in the context of subtractive color mixing as opposed to additive color mixing), despite some criticism due to its lack of scientific basis. f05aa192bb Traffic lights were first introduced in December 1868 on Parliament Square in London to reduce the need for police officers to control traffic. Since then, electricity and computerized control have advanced traffic light technology and increased intersection capacity. The system is also used for other purposes, including the control of pedestrian

movements, variable lane control (such as tidal flow systems or smart motorways), and railway level crossings. f05aa192bb Signalling practice, however, diverged with the introduction of power signalling into each State. New South Wales was first significant adopter of power signalling. It adopted the then standard international practice of displaying three aspects using home above distant signals; this developed into an integrated mechanical/power signalling practice based on route signalling. Victoria and South Australia adopted US speed signalling when they introduced power signalling in 1915; this was... f05aa192bb

Racing flags Typically, the starter, sometimes the grand marshal of a race, waves the flags atop a flag stand near the start-finish line. flag points will display a "VSC board" and all light panels on track will display the letters VSC surrounded by a flashing yellow border.

Alternatively, some race tracks employ lights to supplement the primary flag at the start-finish line. Under the VSC procedure Racing flags are traditionally used in auto racing and similar motorsports to indicate track conditions and to communicate important messages to drivers. Track marshals are also stationed at observation posts along the race track in order to communicate both local and course-wide conditions to drivers f05aa192bb

While there is no universal system of racing flags across all of motorsports, most series have standardized them, with some flags carrying over between series. For example, the chequered flag is commonly used across all of motorsport to signify the end of a session (practice, qualifying, or race), while the penalty flags differ from series to series. FIA-sanctioned championship flags are the most commonly used internationally as they cover championships such as Formula 1, the FIA World Endurance Championship and WTCC, and are adopted (and sometimes adapted) by many more motorsport governing bodies across the world such as, for example, the MSA.... f05aa192bb
