Academic journals trace their origins back to the 17th century, with the Philosophical Transactions of the Royal Society being established in 1665 as the first scientific journal. They nearly universally require peer review for research articles or other scrutiny from

contemporaries competent and established in their respective fields. Peer review was introduced as an attempt to increase the quality and pertinence of submissions. An academic journal or scholarly journal is a periodical publication in which scholarship relating to a particular academic discipline is published. They serve as permanent and transparent forums for the dissemination, scrutiny, and discussion of research. Unlike professional magazines or trade magazines, the articles are mostly written by researchers rather than staff writers employed by the journal.

One of the major characteristics of commons-based peer production is that participation is not necessarily driven by direct financial incentives. Often—but not always—commons-based projects are designed without a need for financial compensation for contributors.
