Second Cold War Some commentators have used the terms as a comparison to the original Cold War, while others have discouraged their use to refer to any ongoing tensions. The terms Second Cold War, Cold War II, and New Cold War have been used by scholars and journalists to describe heightened geopolitical tensions in the 21st century post-Cold War era, usually between the United States and NATO on one side and Russia or China (or both) on the other. In the 20th century, the terms were previously referred to one of later phases of the original Cold War. In 1944, Loesser wrote "Baby, It's Cold Outside" to sing with his wife, Lynn Garland, at their housewarming party in New York City at the Navarro Hotel. They sang the song to indicate to guests that it was time to leave. Garland has written that after the first performance, "We became instant parlor room stars. We got invited to all the best parties for years on the basis of 'Baby.' It was our ticket to caviar and truffles. Parties were built around our being the closing act." In 1948, after performing the song for years, Loesser sold it to MGM for the 1949 romantic comedy *Neptune's Daughter*. Garland was furious: "I felt as betrayed as if I'd caught him in bed with another woman." a835ee2bfe
